1 **RESOLUTION #22-02** 2 **ENTITLED:** Restrictions on Social Media Depiction of Drugs 3 **SUBMITTED BY:** Dick Huber, MD 4 5 WHEREAS, many of our youth have access and exposure to social media outlets that have great 6 potential to influence our young people regarding drugs, and 7 8 WHEREAS, a recent study published in the Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drug reported on 9 popular alcohol videos on the social networking site TikTok and noted - 98% of the videos expressed pro-alcohol sentiment; nearly half were guide videos demonstrating drink recipes; 10 11 61% depicted consuming multiple drinks quickly; 69% conveyed positive experiences; 55% 12 contained humor; nearly half associated alcohol with camaraderie but only 4% of the videos 13 depicted alcohol with negative associations, and 14 15 WHEREAS, similar results could be anticipated with social media networks with other drugs, 16 therefore be it 17 18 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) instruct our AAFP Delegation to introduce a resolution to the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) to corroborate with other 19 20 organizations, associations and agencies to seek policy and legislation that would limit social 21 media's promotion and dissemination of some information on the usage of drugs to our youth, 22 similar to other restrictions placed on alcohol, tobacco and other drugs. 23 24 Journal of Studies on Alcohol and Drugs 25 #Alcohol: Portrayals of Alcohol in Top Videos on TikTok Published online September 19, 2021 26
