English 12 Credit Requirement Options

Which English class should my student choose?

English 12 English 12 Empower AP Literature IU ACP- W131 and L202

English 12

This course follows English 11 and fulfills the credit requirement.

The focus is reading comprehension and writing, and follows the same state standards as English 11.

English 12 Empower

This course follows English 11 and fulfills the credit requirement.

The focus is reading comprehension and writing, and follows the same state standards as English 11. The Empower course covers exactly what the brick and mortar course covers, but everything is online. Students must be motivated to work without a teacher present. There is a weekly due date that mirrors what many online college courses look like.

AP Literature

Builds on AP Language, but AP Language is not a pre-requisite. Students must have passed ISTEP+ English before school starts.

This course builds on AP Language; to gain college credit students must perform well on the College Board AP test given in May. Colleges choose what grade (1-5) they will accept and for what type of credit. State currently pays for English AP tests.

IU-ACP- W131 and L202

3 IU credits per semester; Composition and Literary Analysis Students must have passed ISTEP+ English before school starts.

W131- Composition- Fall Semester; L202-Lit Analysis- Spring

- Each semester is 3 IU credits; ACP classes are easily transferred.

ACP continued:

- Each semester is 3 credits, each credit costs \$25 (\$75 per semester) money is paid to IU. They send a bill in November and April.
 - Students whom qualify for free/reduced lunch qualify for free ACP credit.
- Course is set up and taught exactly to IU standards. I am happy to make the syllabus available.
 - High School grade and IU grade are the same (this is different in ACP courses in other disciplines.)

ACP continued:

- The ACP program is designed for high school juniors and seniors who desire more advanced academic work. ACP is not a gifted and talented program, but potential students should demonstrate a solid academic foundation and motivation to successfully earn college credits. The ACP program will engage students in college courses and help prepare them for future academic work.
- As a prestigious research university respected throughout the country, IU is known for its quality education which applies to ACP program as well. IU credits earned through the ACP program will build the student's IU transcript. These credits are accepted and transferable to many public and private universities. The ACP program will jumpstart the student's academic career, however, student participation in ACP does not constitute automatic admission to IU.

"WBL is a framework of various pathways, which include practical experiences to help individuals gain an understanding of an occupation with on-the-job learning. It ranges from career awareness to career training."

Designed to enhance students': Career Awareness; Career Exploration; Career Preparation; Career Training

WBL takes up periods 6 and 7 of student's daily schedule. Students release for worksite at 1 pm each school day. IRP on Wednesdays. 1st half WBL class-time. 2nd half - IRP meetings/remediation


Students must have driver's license and insurance information on file. Students and parents must read WBL contract and accept all

Requirements for Empower courses

- Students must meet the pre-requisites for the course and complete the online application which is available in Naviance prior to the course being placed in their schedule.
- Student must have and maintain at least a 2.0 GPA

Work Ethic Certification (WEC)

Requirements for WEC:

- 1. Be a senior
- 2. Opt in through application process
- 3. Have 98% attendance rate during senior year
- 4. Maintain a 2.0 cumulative GPA
- 5. Have no more than 1 behavioral referral
- 6. Complete a minimum of 6 hours of community service

Early Graduation-7 Semester Graduation

- ★ Application deadline, February 7th
- ★ Completion of all credits for a Core 40 or Core 40 with honors diploma
- ★ Passed both English and Algebra ISTEP
- ★ Completion of a 7 seven semester graduation application
- ★ Completion of a typed letter of rationale for the need for mid-term graduation
- ★ Because English 12 is a full year course, students will be required to take one semester during the summer and one semester in the classroom. If a student does not complete this requirement, he/she will be ineligible to be a seven semester graduate.
- ★ One or more of the criteria may be waived at administrator discretion or through case conference committee decision

- ★ Counselor Presentations in IRP
- \star Complete scheduling worksheet
- \star Confirm diploma choice and review requirements
- ★ Online Course Requests beginning January 14th
 - Worksheet must be completed in order to request courses online
- ★ Request Summary, <u>signature required</u>
- \star Email course request changes through May 1st
 - Most requests approved through March 20th
 - Requests approved by availability through May 1st
