Interested students must submit applications to the IUPUI O'Neill School of Public and Environmental Affairs by March 1.

Qualified applicants are O'Neill School of Public and Environmental Affairs MPA students with a minimum 3.0 grade point average and an interest in learning the state finance and budget process.

Preferred applicants will have successfully completed the public budgeting and finance, economics, and statistics courses prior to the spring semester of their fellowship.
