#### Franklin College Hosts Rare Exhibit

Thanks to the generosity of Honorary Trustee John D. Peterson, <u>a new exhibit at the</u> <u>B.F. Hamilton Library (Franklin</u> <u>College)</u> gives you the opportunity to handle and explore several historical documents by Thomas Aquinas, Frederick Douglass, Homer, Thomas Jefferson and William Shakespeare, among others. Also in the exhibit are two clay tablets dating back as far as 2500 B.C.E.

Materials in the exhibit, which runs through December 2, are from The Remnant Trust, Inc., a public educational foundation that shares an actively growing collection of manuscripts, first edition and early works and seeks to "awaken in new generations of learners both an interest and competency in issues of individual liberty and human dignity by collaborating with institutions

The exhibit is open for viewing when the <u>library is open.</u> "Show and tell" sessions, are also scheduled weekly: Wednesdays from 9 to 10 a.m. and Thursdays from 4 to 5 p.m.
