



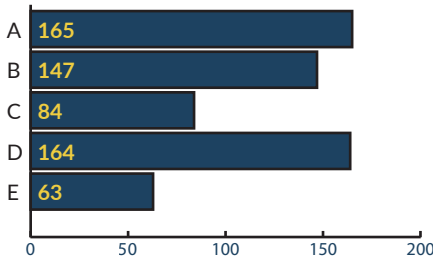

EXECUTIVE ORDER LENGTH

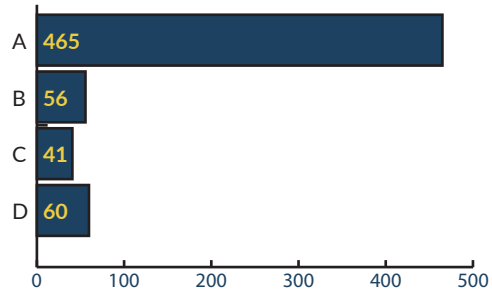

SCHOOL COVID-19 RESPONSE

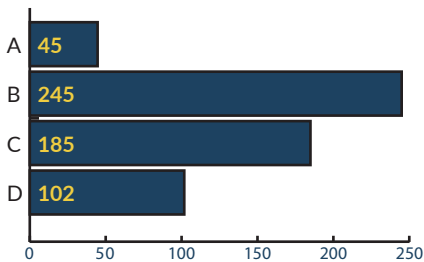

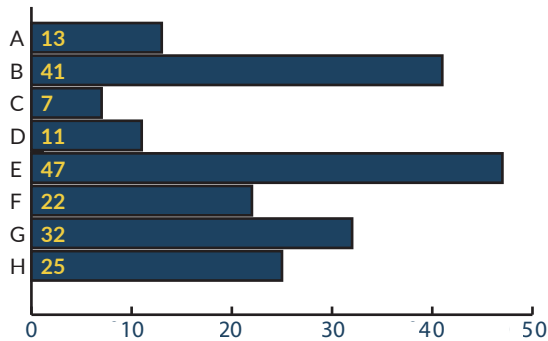

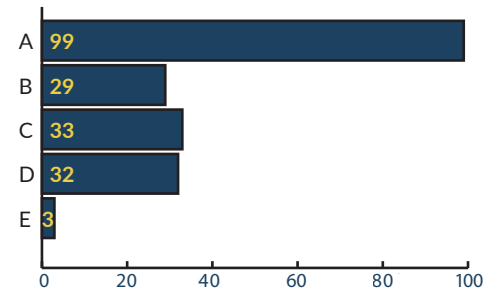

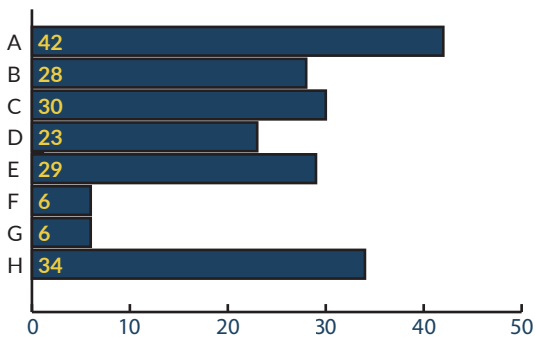

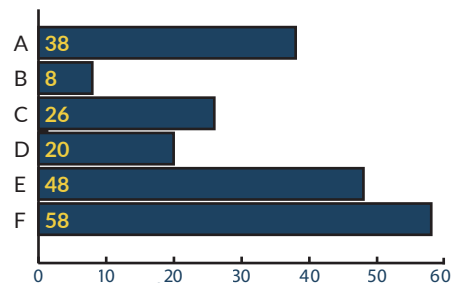

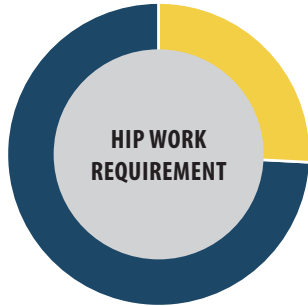

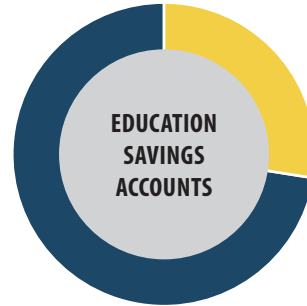
- 8.** Should Indiana require able-bodied adults to work or look for work in order to receive publicly funded health care coverage under the Healthy Indiana Plan?
