
Dear friends,

# GRANTS

## *Legacies at Work*



**H**istory and mystery merge at the corner of Washington and Wabash streets. The Park House Hotel once stood on the present site of the Masonic Temple. When the Masonic organizations purchased the lot in 1900, along with the deed to the land came a bit of mystery and shocking revelation. When the hotel was torn down, there was talk of a body found in the basement. The sheriff was out of town at the time of the discovery, but when he returned, the body had mysteriously disappeared. No body, no investigation, and one unsolved mystery. The only thing that remained from that mystery was a rumor that the body could have been that of a Ladoga rancher, who drove his cattle into town and then disappeared after checking into the hotel.

The unsolved mystery did not stop construction; the first Masonic Temple brick was laid September 3, 1901, and the cornerstone was laid in October of that year. The laying of the cornerstone was a big event in this community. The grand ceremony kicked off with a parade that included a platoon of police, a band, horse-drawn carriages, and Parade Marshals General Lew Wallace and Governor Winfield Durbin. Guest speaker was Thomas R. Marshall, who later became Governor of Indiana, then Vice President of the United States under President Woodrow Wilson.

Local architect, William Sharpe, worked on the project for several years, making several design changes until a final design was approved. Sharpe was also the architect for the Carnegie Library, which was under construction at the same time as the Masonic Temple. W. P. Jungclaus of Indianapolis was awarded the contract to construct the Masonic Temple, and it was quite the topic of conversation at the time both here and in Indianapolis. The exact date of the completion of the building is unknown, but the dedication took place on May 27, 1904.

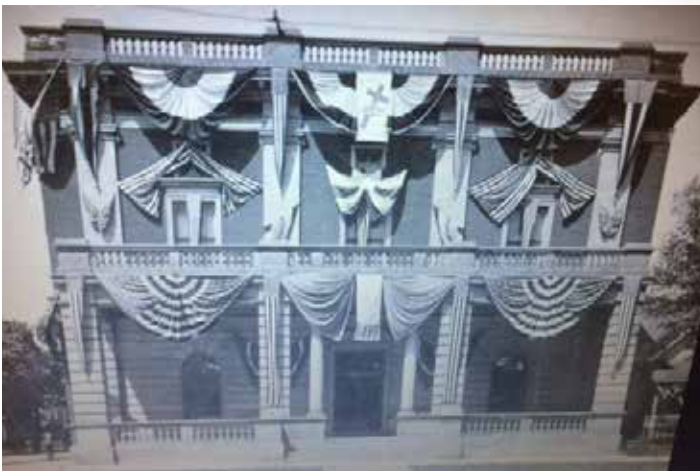
The impressive architectural details of this building include majestic columns, decorative moldings, an intricate mosaic tiled floor, and coved ceilings. It is a full masonry structure with some of the walls as thick as six wythes (six bricks side by side), and an excellent example of neo-classical architecture. The winding twin branches of the grand stairway, located toward the rear of the grand entrance hall, gives access to the mezzanine, where balconies overlook the hall, both parlors, and the grand banquet hall. The back wing was built in 1915 and a modern kitchen added, as well as more room in a theater located on the second floor. The Little Theatre held 210 productions in over more than a quarter of a century of use by the Crawfordsville Dramatic Club. Until the mid-1960s, Crawfordsville High School, Wabash College, and the Sugar Creek Players also used the theatre. Water leaking through the roof eventually caused the ceiling to fall in, damaging the theatre. A broken truss was exposed and repaired. A 2021 MCCF grant for \$30,000 provided funds to replace the roof, which was the first major and necessary project.

The Temple building is not only rich in architecture design and structure, but rich in history as well. During both World Wars, parlors in the Masonic Temple were turned over to the local Red Cross chapter for war work. Rooms in the building were open to all men in uniform of our country, where they received warm hospitality and meals. General Lew Wallace gave speeches and attended community events at the Temple, and he was one of five Civil War generals who were members of the Masons. While the Masonic Temple was originally built by and for Masonic organizations, the first floor was designed exclusively for social purposes. Over the 100+ years of existence, it has been a venue for weddings, receptions, school and business events, and numerous other social functions.

Though the Masonic Temple was built to last, maintenance and repairs necessary to prevent structural failure became quite costly, and the building began to deteriorate. As the active members of the Masonic organizations began to decline, maintaining the building became financially overwhelming. The Masons received a grant from Indiana Historic Landmarks in 2014 for a preservation study. The study noted the strengths and weaknesses of the building and provided a phased plan to repair and restore the aging building. In 2015, the Crawfordsville Masonic Temple Foundation (CMTF, a 501c3 nonprofit organization) formed with the sole purpose of saving this historic structure. They determined that many costly repairs, including roof and window replacement, masonry repair, and upgrades to the kitchen and bathrooms are necessary. The Masons decided to transfer the building and most of its furnishings to the CMTF in 2019 in the hopes of saving the structure.

The current major project is to repair or replace the windows, which have wood frames and sashes over 100 years old. In 2022, MCCF awarded a grant of \$40,000 to CMTF for window restoration. Brick and mortar repair, electrical upgrades, floor and plaster repairs are just some of the other projects on the horizon. As repairs and restoration continue, the building is in frequent use and open to the public.

This unique and significant historical treasure is on the National Register of Historic Places as part of the Crawfordsville Downtown Historic District. The dignity of its architecture, the beauty of its exterior, and its central location, have made it an outstanding asset in our community for over 100 years. Renamed the Masonic Cornerstone Grand Hall and Event Center, the building is slowly returning to its former glory and grandeur. With community support, and a board dedicated to its preservation, we can look forward to the restored and renovated building being enjoyed for generations to come.

# PROJECT SWADDLE

**“Do the best you can until you know better, then when you know better, do better.”** This quote by Maya Angelou reflects the thinking behind Project Swaddle and their mission to provide education, along with prenatal care, to mothers with high-risk pregnancies. Community Paramedic, Darren Forman, and the Project Swaddle team, realize that best practices for expectant mothers and child care, are constantly changing and improving. Their goal is to provide the most up-to-date information and education, and dispel myths and misinformation that are passed down generationally. This focus on education, combined with quality medical care and personal attention, helps stabilize fears, relieve anxiety, and ensure that at-risk mothers have a healthy pregnancy and safe delivery.

One such mother is Zoey, seen in the photo with son, Cooper, just 29 days old at the time. This was her second time as a Project Swaddle client. Zoey has great respect for Darren, stating that he is direct and tells her what to expect, and is always available and informative. She developed gestational diabetes during her first pregnancy, and was so grateful for the medical care and emotional support she received through this program. For Darren, walking a mom to the finish line of a successful pregnancy is extremely gratifying and rewarding. He is passionate about the entire scope of Project Swaddle – which is evident in the strong relationships he develops with the clients. The mothers he serves know that they have access to him 24/7.



At the time of this writing, there was a recent incident where an anxious first-time mom called Darren at night concerned that her infant might need to go to the emergency room. He went to the home, evaluated the baby, and determined that all was well. The baby was spared a trip to the ER, and the mother's fears were alleviated. There are many stories like that one. Reducing hospital admissions, emergency room visits, and overall health costs are just some of the goals of Project Swaddle. Other goals include reducing poor maternal and infant health outcomes, improved access to prenatal and postpartum healthcare, and ensuring safe home environments for raising a family.



Montgomery County, like many rural communities, faces challenges that include teen pregnancies, lack of prenatal care during the first trimester, substance abuse, and limited access to healthcare. We are fortunate that the Crawfordsville Fire Department is a statewide leader in addressing some of these rural health challenges. In 2017, through a grant from the Indiana State Department of Health, the CFD launched its nationally recognized Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) Community Paramedicine Program. This holistic approach focuses on collaborative team-based care. Along with Project Swaddle, MIH offers programs that serve those with chronic illness, a quick response team for those dealing with substance abuse, and a newly launched vaccination/immunization program.

# BOYS & GIRLS CLUB OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY

**Rough, worn out and ugly are not adjectives you want ascribed to you – unless you are flooring that has served the community well for many years.** After 22 years of scrubbing, cleaning, waxing, and stain removal, the tile and carpet at the Boys & Girls Club was in dire need of replacing. A recent MCCF grant of \$32,500 provided a much-needed facelift, and funds were used to install new LVT flooring throughout the entire building, with the exception of the gym and multi-use room. The children were very excited about the new flooring, and quite proud of the difference it made in their club.

The Boys & Girls Club is a youth guidance organization dedicated in helping youth in our community, especially those from disadvantaged circumstances. The Club serves our county youth, ages 5-18, in a safe and nurturing environment. The mission of the Boys and Girls Club is to enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible citizens. This is achieved by cultivating meaningful relationships, encouraging positive attitudes, and promoting education and good sportsmanship. Thoroughly trained staff provide stability, consistency, and a sense of belonging and ownership.

Since its inception in 1956, the Club has served thousands of children and their families in Montgomery County. It was originally located in an old fire station on College Street, but is now located on Whitlock Avenue where a new building was constructed in 2000. The Club currently serves approximately 3,000 children from our community. The durable, beautiful new flooring gives new life to the facility – a facility that will continue to give back by serving thousands of our youth in years to come.

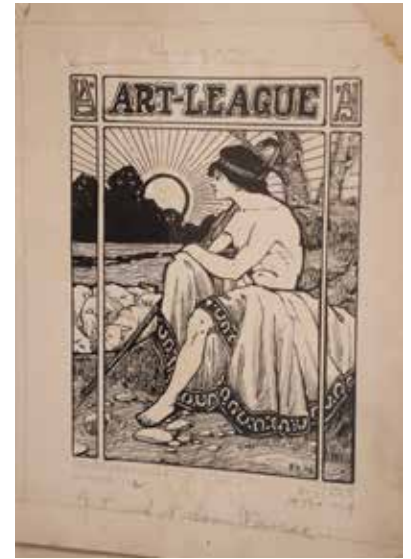


# Art League of Montgomery County

Originating in 1896, the Art League of Montgomery County is the county's longest existing cultural group. The League is dedicated to preserving and protecting arts in our community. They encourage and support local art and artists by sponsoring art-focused events and by creating experiences in all forms of art. For many years, the League has loaned its collection of art to the Crawfordsville District Public Library for exhibition. This gives our community a richer art experience, and helps the community become familiar with art of local and historical significance.

The League owns several paintings by artists from the late 1890s – artists who lived and worked in Montgomery County. After so many years on display, or in storage, some of this valuable, historical art needed to be cleaned and restored. After an assessment, it was determined that seven paintings were a priority. The League received a MCCF grant of \$2,425 to clean and repair the seven paintings, and conservator, Sharon Battista, completed the restoration project. Art League President, Kathy Steele, stated that the colors in the paintings are now vibrant, and show the true beauty of each piece.

Our community is fortunate in that we have many historical treasures, including museums, historic figures, and works of art. Looking forward, future generations will be able to view these historic pieces of art at the library for the next hundred years.

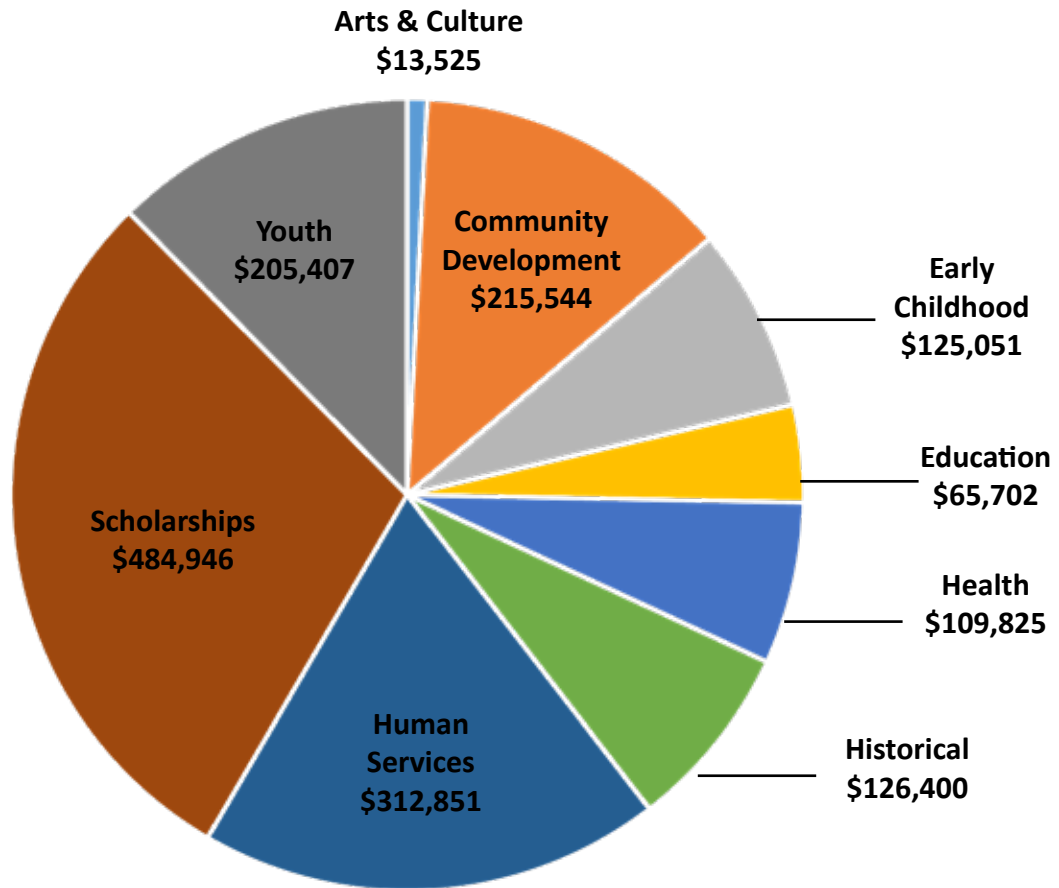

## Women's Legacy Fund



The Women's Legacy Fund awarded \$14,400 in grants in 2022. The Women's Legacy Fund (WLF) of the Montgomery County Community Foundation is a group of women committed to making a positive impact on the lives of women and children in Montgomery County. They do this by pooling their philanthropic gifts to increase the impact of their efforts.

Each member makes a yearly financial contribution to WLF with a portion going to an endowment and a portion to funding grants. The members select the grants to fund.

# 2022 Grant Awards

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, MCCF grants have grown from \$2,000 in 1992 to \$1.6 million in 2022. In 2013, we were able to fund 48% of grant requests; in 2022, that number increased to 96%. We offer two grant cycles each year where nonprofit agencies can submit proposals for grant requests. These grants are funded through our unrestricted and field of interest funds. In addition, our designated funds provide annual support to the organizations specified in the fund agreement. Our donor advised funds provide support to the organizations recommended by the fund owner and approved by the MCCF Board. **Early childhood education remains a top strategic initiative for the MCCF.** Working together with the Montgomery County Early Childhood Coalition (MCECC), we have devoted much time and effort to strengthen and support our network of child care providers. On-site support and coaching, professional development training, and our first-ever summer camp program, are some examples of the tremendous progress and accomplishments in this vital area. Below are some 2022 highlights:

**Week of the Young Child:** The first week in April was proclaimed Week of the Young Child in Montgomery County by Mayor Todd Barton and Montgomery County Commissioners John Frey, Dan Guard, and Jim Fulwider. This proclamation is in support and appreciation for our community's youngest citizens and their caregivers. The proclamation stresses the importance of affordable, high-quality early childhood programs for residents, as well as sufficient seats and safety measures. The document also praised the work of early childhood educators and advocated for improved wages, benefits, and training. Our community celebrated in big ways during the Week of the Young Child, and each day was marked with a theme: Music Monday, Tasty Tuesday, Work Together Wednesday, Artsy Thursday, and Family Friday. Local early childhood educators were encouraged to plan activities around the themes to involve their students.



**Professional Learning Series:** Duke Energy sponsored quarterly workshops where we held professional development opportunities for local early childhood educators. The workshops offered topics such as, positive guidance, infant and toddler social and emotional development, and setting up classroom environments. These free workshops included meals and classroom supplies for all attendees. The purpose of these learning series was to strengthen and support a high-quality learning environment for the children in their care.



**2nd Annual Early Learning Expo:** The second annual Early Learning Expo took place in August at the Masonic Cornerstone Grand Hall & Event Center. This free event provided education and support to over 50 teachers and directors of local early learning and child care providers. Keynote speaker was Maureen Weber of Early Learning Indiana. Several on-site vendors shared products and some great swag for attendees. The MCECC, through generous support from donors, provided three great door prizes: New Beginnings won a book nook (*photo*), Hand in Hand won a magnetic easel, and New Hope Preschool won a light table sensory bundle.

**Child Development Associate Credential:** Finding qualified staff for our child care programs is an ongoing challenge. The MCECC partnered with Ivy Tech Community College to offer a Child Development Associate Co-Hort program. Early childhood educators can attend classes in person at the local Crawfordsville site. This program will serve to increase the number of trained child care providers in our community, and also support the current providers who want to increase their education. MCCF Early Learning Director, Lisa Walter, is the instructor for this course.



**Camp Milligan and Camp Holly Jolly Days:** In partnership with the Crawfordsville Parks & Rec, we launched Camp Milligan. This all-day summer camp program was a huge success with 35 children participating. Campers enjoyed weekly field trips, hands-on learning, physical activities, and much more! Through the generous support of our community, a classroom at the Community Center was transformed into a fun and fully equipped “base camp”. North Montgomery School Corporation graciously provided the transportation for the field trips, and local community members visited the camp each week to help extend the weekly curriculum. Camp Milligan was a huge success and plans are underway for Camp Milligan 2023.



**During the Christmas season, Camp Holly Jolly Days** offered parents five opportunities to finish holiday shopping or to-do lists while their child enjoyed some festive fun. Each day featured multiple activities, including a holiday movie, holiday themed reading, writing and craft activities, gym games, and outside exploration. Over 75 total campers enjoyed this winter break edition of Camp Milligan.

**Montgomery County Early Learning Center:** Plans are moving forward for construction of a new child care facility in our community. The Early Learning Center is a transformational project and an investment opportunity that will support our greatest asset – our children. Our current child care educators are committed to providing high-quality education and support. However, the fact remains that more high-quality seats are needed in Montgomery County as we are able to serve only 11% of our children under the age of five with high-quality care. Strong partnerships with local government and businesses formed to help fund this innovative and creative solution to expand child care seats in our community. The new center will provide high quality care for 124 children, ages infant to five. *(Architect's drawing of Center below)*



As highlighted above, this year was a busy one in the area of early childhood education. The vision of the MCECC is for all Montgomery County children to be ready to succeed in school and life. There is much cause for optimism as the progress, and the work, continues. The work we have already accomplished would not be possible without the generosity of our donors, and we are grateful. With your continued support, we can make a big difference for the smallest of our Montgomery County citizens.



**WORKING** with children has been a passion for Marley Dyson for as long as she can remember.

Growing up, teachers made a big impact on her life and greatly influenced her decision to become an educator. As a first generation college student, Marley welcomed the opportunity to attend college, but lacked the resources to do so. She worked hard and applied for scholarships, and she was grateful to receive the MCCF Fred and Ina Clark Scholarship. That award, along with other funding, helped provide her with the resources she needed. She is currently a senior at Purdue University pursuing a degree in Special Education.

Marley knew right away that if she wanted to be successful at college, she needed to develop healthy study habits. That was one of the hardest adjustments she had to make as a freshman. Her biggest challenge continues to be within. She knows she is capable, but like all of us at times, doubts rise up and get in her way. However, Marley is determined and is close to achieving her goal. College continues to be a wonderful experience for Marley - she enjoys meeting new people, and discovering more about who she is as an individual. Her advice to incoming college freshmen would be to step outside of your comfort zone, and to let go of preconceived ideas about life at college because each person's experience is unique.

This past summer, Marley gained invaluable experience working with children. She was one of the counselors at Camp Milligan, a summer camp program created by the Montgomery County Early Childhood Coalition in partnership with the Crawfordsville Parks and Recreation Department. That job offered helpful insight to her future career in education. It provided her the opportunity to gain important skills she will need as a teacher, such as, creating activities, engaging students, and classroom management. Her experience as a summer camp counselor confirmed her decision to become an educator, and she looks forward to making a difference in the lives of students and their families.

To be considered for the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship, students must be a resident of Montgomery County, have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.85 on a 4.00 scale, and be in the top 10% of their graduating class at an accredited Montgomery County high school. Marshall, along with 34 other local applicants, participated in a highly selective review process that evaluated academic achievement, student activities and leadership, and two essay responses. Finalists were also required to appear before the Board of Directors of the Montgomery County Community Foundation for two interviews.

Lilly Endowment created the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Program for the 1998-1999 school year and has supported the program every year since with tuition grants totaling in excess of \$439 million. More than 5,000 Indiana students have received the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship since the program's inception. Two of the primary purposes of the LECS is to help raise the level of educational attainment in Indiana, and to increase awareness of the beneficial roles Indiana community foundations can play in their communities.

# NEW FUNDS

## *Establishing a Legacy*

### The William M. and Louise O. Allen Scholarship Fund

William and Louise Allen were born in 1875, yet today they are helping local students attend college. William grew up in Terre Haute, the youngest of 11 children. His father was a judge and served as mayor. William was a member of the class of 1897 at Wabash College, and after spending some time in Denver and Chicago, he moved to Montgomery County. Louise was the youngest of 10 children and prior to moving to Montgomery County, she worked in the hotel business in St. Louis, Missouri, and later spent some time in Chicago. William and Louise did not have any survivors and after William's death, Louise created a will that would "permit enjoyment of my estate by as many of my friends and as many residents of this community as possible, since I have no close relatives." Through a trust at PNC Bank, she established a scholarship to assist graduates of Montgomery County high schools. This trust was recently transferred to the Montgomery County Community Foundation and will provide support for students needing financial assistance.

### The Kenneth and Patricia Bane Fund

Kenny and Patricia Bane were high school sweethearts who married young, and then spent a lifetime together working hard and supporting each other in various business endeavors. Entrepreneurs at heart, they poured their time and energy into their beloved community of Wingate, Indiana, while raising three children. Their family, their church, and their community were all very important to them. In their early years, Pat operated a Marathon gas station in Wingate, while Kenny hauled Studebakers from Indiana to Montana. Their children recall that most meal times at the kitchen table were spent watching the gas pumps, and they rarely ate a meal without interruption. Kenny also worked on cars, and Pat washed them and kept the books – a real partnership.

In 1967, Kenny considered a different job opportunity with J.I. Case Company, and Pat thought he had lost his mind! However, Bane Equipment Sales soon became a reality, and Pat was fully on board with her support. Kenny passed away in 1999, and Pat continued working and making deliveries for the business up until a few months before her death in 2021. Phil Bane and his wife, Sally, established this fund to honor the strong work ethic of his parents, and the tremendous legacy they left behind. The Kenneth and Patricia Bane fund will provide support to the North Montgomery High School FFA.





## The Missie Bickel No Hill for a Climber Fund



No hill for a climber means a task, which appears daunting to most, is just another obstacle that must be overcome before facing the next obstacle. For nine years, Missie Bickel battled metastatic breast cancer one hill at a time. Missie endured chemotherapy, radiation, and numerous surgeries but she refused to allow cancer to diminish her kind and compassionate spirit. Most of us would feel total hopelessness when faced with the reality of a Stage IV cancer diagnosis, but Missie chose hope over hopelessness. Missie continued to live her life to the fullest and did not blink when she was offered an opportunity for adventure. Whether it be a weeklong trip to New York City or horseback riding in the beautiful Rocky Mountain National Park – Missie was all in. Through her philanthropic work, Missie showed us the importance of always having others in mind

and doing your best to support them. Missie had absolute love for God, family, friends, and her community. Missie's husband, Mark, along with Tyler Baer, established this unrestricted fund in her memory with the hope that it will help our community climb some hills.

## The Roger and Judy Hildebrand Fund

For the majority of their lives, Roger and Judy Hildebrand have made Montgomery County their home. Roger owned and operated FACTS Inc. until his retirement, and Judy provided hair styling services. They have long enjoyed the benefits of this great community, and they wanted to find a way to keep that benefit going for others. Roger and Judy are faithful supporters of the MCCF and familiar with the good work accomplished in the community. They wanted to do more for the greater good, and they understood that they could do more by establishing an endowed fund than what they could do on their own. Knowing that there are always pressing needs that change over time, they chose to establish this unrestricted fund so that the MCCF Board of Directors can decide where to direct support from their fund. Roger and Judy continue to stay active in the community through their church, and through volunteer work in other nonprofit organizations.



## The Van Johnson Scholarship Fund



Donovan "Van" David Johnson was raised on a farm where five generations have lived; a place where family gatherings were held, holidays were celebrated, and memories were made. His family now hold those memories even closer to their hearts as Van passed away from injuries sustained in a car accident in February 2022. Van was known for his kindness, his sense of humor, and his concern for others. Spending quality time with family and friends was important to Van, and he treasured the valuable life lessons learned from the older generation. Though he will always be deeply missed by all who loved him, Van's family has great peace knowing he placed his faith and trust in God. Van was a junior at Southmont High School and studied broadcast journalism. With the help of a good friend, his parents, Chad and Amy Johnson, along with his sister Ally, established the Van Johnson Scholarship Fund as one way to share Van's loving, generous spirit with others. This fund will provide support to graduates of Southmont High School.

## The Payton Kobel Fund



If you combine intelligence and independence, a dry sense of humor and quick wit, you will have an idea of the personality of Payton Kobel. However, the immeasurable worth and significance of a life can never be described that simply. There are so many variables and factors that make us who we are. Payton was a 2018 North Montgomery High School graduate who excelled both academically and athletically. He was Academic All-State in football and track, and a Provost Scholarship recipient. Payton was an IU Founders Scholar at Indiana University, as well as a direct admit to the Kelley School of Business. His love of sports went beyond his own participation and he faithfully followed the Bears and the Cubs, and of course, IU. Like most young people, he loved hanging out with his friends, and he left an impression with all those who were fortunate enough to meet him. His premature death in February 2020 left a depth of grief impossible to describe or comprehend, but his loved ones would want you to remember all that Payton was, rather than focus on his death. To that end, his family, Rocky, Krista, and Kade Kobel, established this scholarship fund to benefit North Montgomery High School graduates as a way to honor and remember their beloved son and brother, and to give back to this community.

## The Youth Are Our Future Fund

When Mike and his wife, Terri, moved to Montgomery County in 1991, they didn't have any family ties or connections in this area, other than Mike's job at Tri-County Bank. However, Mike said that they found the community to be very welcoming, and they quickly embraced living and working here. Mike's philosophy in life is to do whatever he can, wherever he is, to create a beneficial, positive impact. To that end, he established the Youth Are Our Future Fund out of a desire to see the youth in our community succeed in life. This fund will provide support for youth focused organizations and programs serving the youth of Montgomery County. Mike's intention is to give our youth opportunities that will make a positive impact on them, and thereby increase their positive impact in not only our community, but also wherever they go in life. There is no way to predict what the specific needs will be for our youth in the future, so this field of interest fund allows for a broad range of needs to be met as they arise. Mike trusts that MCCF will help facilitate those needs today, tomorrow, and well in to the future.

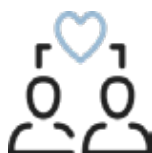
# What types of funds can a donor establish at MCCF?

## Unrestricted Fund



An Unrestricted Fund addresses a broad range of local needs - including future needs that often cannot be anticipated at the time your gift is made. An unrestricted fund enables the Board of Directors to choose the most worthy and needy recipients of your fund's distribution over time according to the current needs of the community. We consider all aspects of community well-being: arts and culture, community development, education, health and human services, historical, and more. The flexibility of your unrestricted gift enables the MCCF to support long-term solutions, and meet the ever-changing needs in our community. Fund minimum is \$5,000.

## Designated Fund



A Designated Fund provides a wonderful way to give back to one or more specific organizations that have touched your life. A designated fund allows you to choose specifically the charity, or charities, that you wish to support. Your gift provides the organization you choose with a permanent source of reliable funding, creating a long-term impact. Your favorite organization will also benefit from the MCCF's investment stewardship and ability to manage endowment funds. Fund minimum is \$5,000.

## Donor Advised Fund



A Donor Advised Fund allows you to make non-binding grant recommendations to the MCCF Board of Directors, thus allowing you more interaction with your fund. Fund minimum is \$5,000.

## Field of Interest Fund



A Field of Interest Fund allows you to choose a particular area of charitable interest that you would like to support. The Board of Directors then identifies the most qualified local charities which work to support your area of interest. Fund minimum is \$5,000.

## Scholarship Fund



A Scholarship Fund provides assistance to Montgomery County students. Scholarship criteria may be broadly or narrowly defined, as you choose. Please note that for administrative reasons, scholarship funds require a minimum contribution of \$25,000.

## Pathway Plans



A Pathway Plan is a planned giving agreement that allows you to build a named fund over five years. You may establish the fund immediately with a minimum of \$1,000 and add to it over five years until it reaches \$5,000 and becomes an endowed fund.

## DONOR STORY

### Leaving a Legacy

Marvin Oliver has ties to Montgomery County that are over two hundred years old. In the 1820s, several members of the Oliver family purchased land and settled near Whitesville, and the Oliver Cemetery still exists today on Nucor land in that area. Marvin, and his wife, Gloria, are life-long residents of this community where they have worked, raised a family, and now enjoy retirement.



Prior to retirement, Gloria worked at Cargill in Linden for 31 years, and Marvin spent the bulk of his career at Tipmont REMC. In 2003, Marvin had an opportunity to join the staff at MCCF where he spent the next 13 years before retiring. Through his work at MCCF, Marvin gained valuable insight as he learned about the ever-changing and diverse needs of our local nonprofits. He heard grant recipients speak about how MCCF grants helped support their work in our community, providing them with the resources necessary to maintain and sustain their vital programs. Gloria's volunteer work in the community added even more understanding, and they donated faithfully to the MCCF.

But they wanted to do even more. Using payroll deductions, Marvin and Gloria started a Pathway Fund, which allowed them to build their fund over a period of five years until fully endowed. However, just two years later, when Lilly Endowment Inc. announced their GIFT VI (Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow) with a dollar for dollar match, they decided to make a very generous donation that would make their fund fully endowed. Marvin and Gloria chose to establish an unrestricted fund because they felt that would best serve our community in the future.

For the past several years, they have donated to their fund through IRA distributions. Since the distribution comes directly to MCCF, it saves the Olivers from paying income tax on their required minimum distribution. At the same time, it allows them to support a cause for which they strongly believe. That choice benefits everyone!

Marvin and Gloria continue to remain active as they both volunteer at MCCF and other organizations as needed. When the weather is warm, you can probably find Marvin enjoying his favorite pastime – playing golf at Rocky Ridge where he is a member of the Senior Golf League. We are grateful to the Olivers, and so many like them, who give back for the benefit of others, and help ensure that our community will be better positioned to meet future needs.

*Over the last seven years, the Gloria and Marvin Oliver Fund has provided over \$24,000 for grants in our community. Because it is an unrestricted fund, it has supported a wide variety of needs in the areas of human services, historical, community development, and youth.*

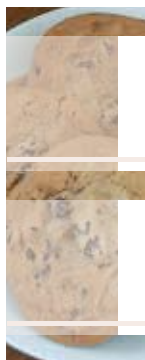

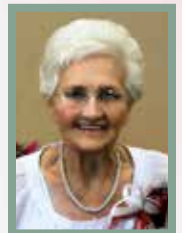

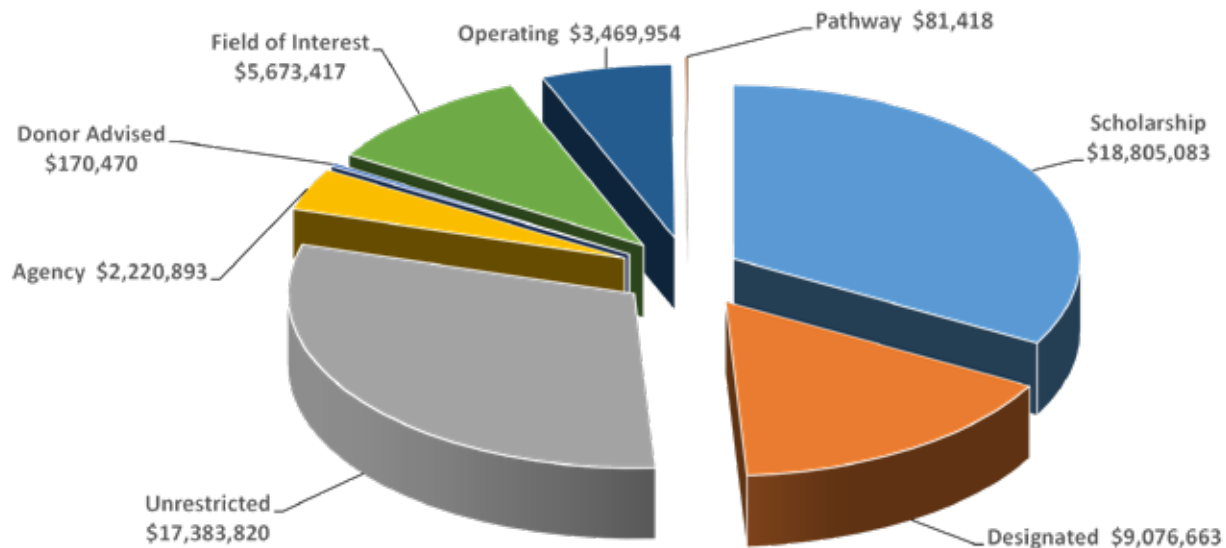
