



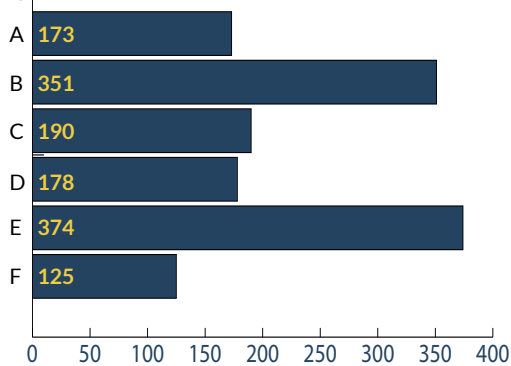

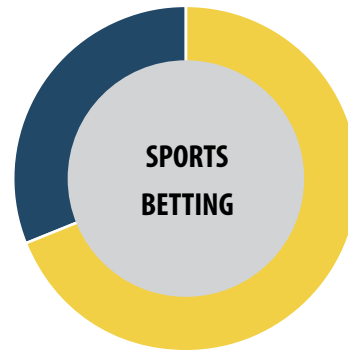
- 1.** When the legislature adopts a new state budget during the 2019 session, which one of the following do you think should be the top priority?

- F) Other



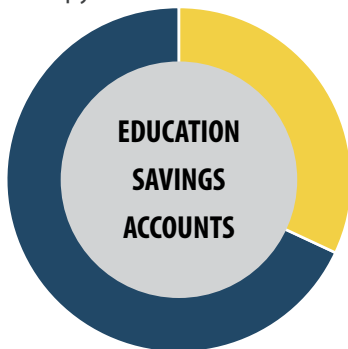
- 2.** Do you support or oppose legalizing sports betting in Indiana?

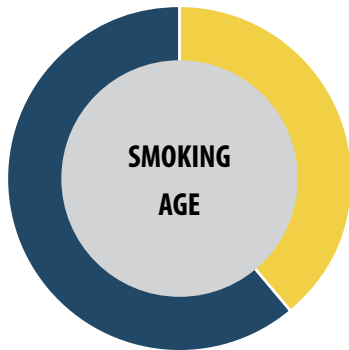

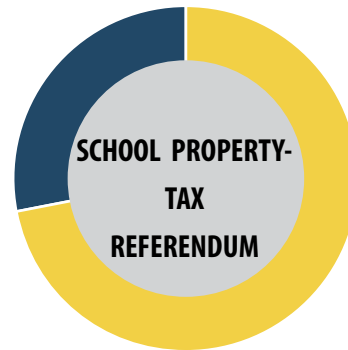

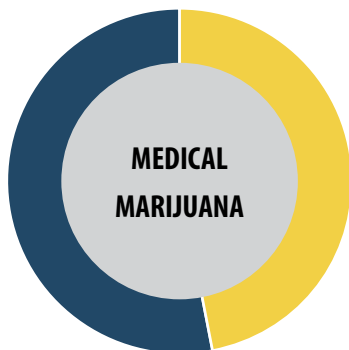
- 7.** Do you support or oppose giving schools the power to propose more than one property-tax referendum in any one year?

**72%**

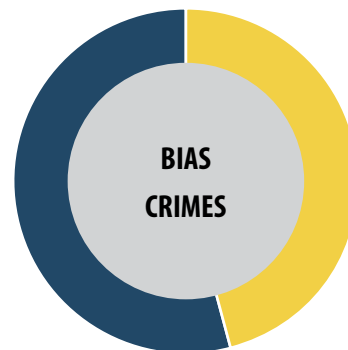
