Indiana Academic Standards

Have you ever wondered why the expectations for your child's reading and writing skills have become so challenging? Below are examples of what the *Indiana Academic Standards* for *Reading* in grades K-5 expect...

RN.2: KEY IDEAS AND TEXTUAL SUPPORT-Students extract and construct meaning from nonfiction texts using a range of comprehension skills.

- <u>Kindergarten</u>: With support, ask and answer questions about important elements of a text (e.g., events, topics, concepts).
- <u>1 Grade</u>: Ask and answer questions about key details to clarify and confirm understanding of a text.
- <u>2 Grade</u>: Ask and answer questions about the main idea and supporting facts and details in a text to confirm understanding.
- <u>3 Grade</u>: Ask and answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text, referring explicitly to the text as the basis for the answers.
- <u>4 Grade</u>: Refer to details and examples in a text when explaining what a text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text.
- <u>5 Grade</u>: Quote accurately from a text when explaining what a text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text



Academic Goals

Students at each grade level are responsible for mastering certain math facts. Please encourage your student to practice his or her math facts for a few minutes each day. Find creative ways for your child to practice their math facts.

For example:

*they can practice orally by skip counting *they can write them on a worksheet *they can use flash cards *they can use an app or a math web site *they can play math games with a deck of cards.
