# 2023: A Bicentennial Year

Johnson County and Franklin to celebrate

**Happy Birthday City of Franklin** and Johnson County! On December 31, 1822, Indiana Governor William Hendricks signed a bill creating Johnson County. On March 8, 1823, the first county election took place, officially creating the government of the county. The landscape looked

quite different then, with the northern part of the county a swamp and most of the rest of the county covered by dense forest. Pioneers had to deal with bears, panthers, and rattlesnakes!

Franklin celebrates its founding in 1823 as well. George King donated the land that became the

future county seat. At the time, the entire population of the county only numbered in the hundreds. We have come so far since then! The year 2023 will be very exciting for the community.



How is a Bicentennial celebrated? First, and something we do well around here, we get the whole community involved! Among the celebrations, there will be a kick-off event for the county on March 8 and the Johnson County Museum of History will be opening an exhibit celebrating Franklin's Bicentennial on April 13. September 30 will see the Bicentennial Celebration for the whole county,

built around Franklin's Fall Festival right here in the county seat. It's no secret that historians love anniversaries and we at the Johnson County Museum of History hope you can join us at all of these great events!
