LJC SIGNATURE PROGRAM COMMUNITY PROJECTS

The LJC Signature Program focuses on five key objectives during the nine-month intensive training: knowing our community, leadership theory and practice, making projects happen, personal leadership development, and building relationships and networks. As a requirement of graduation, members of the class are divided into small groups to develop and implement a community based project where classroom learning meets real-world problem solving. This year's projects were as unique as the 43-member class and added a great exclamation mark to our 25th year of leadership training!



AssistAnts – Assisting Those in Need

AssistAnts worked with ASSIST, a nonprofit organization in Franklin that provides counseling and emergency items for victims of domestic violence. The group hosted a hygiene donation drive, raising over \$200 and collecting over 1,000 hygiene items that were used to make 95 complete hygiene kits. Additionally, the group created a guide for future LJC project groups working with nonprofit organizations.

Gray Matters

Gray Matters worked with Johnson County Senior Services (JCSS) to raise funds for the purchase of a new small transit bus with hydraulic lift. JCSS was awarded an INDOT grant to cover 80% of the cost, with a responsibility to raise the remaining 20% or approximately \$10,000. Gray Matters met their fundraising goal by hosting Foodie Fest and Cakes for a Cause – a showcase of food and bakery items from local restaurants, hosting Chick-fil-A lunch deliveries, and participating in the Main & Madison tip donation program.
