<u>onsumer Inquiry Protocol</u>: A simple series of steps to be followed in order to understand the service needs of a customer, leading to accurate service referrals.

- * **Engagement:** Staff members will listen and help callers communicate their needs and frame their questions or requests for assistance.
- * **Direction:** Staff members will give the callers a name and number of the appropriate agency that can address their issue(s).
- * Assurance: Staff members will inform callers that if the agency they were directed to is not the correct one, or it is unable to meet their need, they should call us back and we will work with them again. "Let us know how things turn out."

<u>Customer First Standards</u>: Standards of employee interaction that include the following related to NWD.

- * Phone messages received will be responded to (if requested) in a timely manner two business days even if just to acknowledge receipt. An estimate of time to resolve the problem will be given if applicable.
- * Respond to customers in a courteous manner, as they deserve to be treated with respect.
- * Employees will take responsibility for providing a solution and/or options to the customer's request.
- * Provide accurate and understandable solutions/options to customer requests or direct the customer to the appropriate person who may have knowledge in the subject matter.

Agency Description: While community perception sometimes is that APS exists to place people in care facilities, the goal is actually to maintain as much freedom in the elder's life as possible. Many clients who are mentally capable are able to refuse APS assistance. Others benefit from referrals made by APS on their behalf, and cooperatively accept the help. More vulnerable clients who are at a higher risk of harm may be in need of court intervention.

Early Head Start (ages 0 - 3) and Head Start (ages 3-5) is determined by income eligibility at 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines.

Services Provided: Help Me Grow and Early Head Start provide home visits to families which include fun activities, playgroups, support, health screenings, developmental screenings, and referrals. Moving Beyond Depression is a free in-home treatment program available to mothers enrolled in these programs with children 0 - 3 years. Head Start is a preschool for eligible families partnering with them to offer early education services to include health, nutrition, and mental health services and referrals.
