# COLLEGE RECEIVES ESTATE GIFT SUPPORTING EDUCATION PROGRAM

Franklin College has announced an estate gift of \$100,000 establishing the endowed Ted Marston Teaching Fund. The gift comes from the late Ted L. Marston, a long-time trustee and his late wife Alma "Elaine" Marston, both alumni of the college. The Marstons had a lifelong passion for education. They established an original fund in 2011 to provide support for promising young Franklin College students pursuing careers as educators. This estate gift will be added to that fund to create a permanent endowment, increasing its impact for education students. It will provide financial assistance in support of the college's Education program, including student financial assistance, virtual technology needs, support of the Marston Education Curriculum Resource Center and department-related travel.

# College Nominated for 2021 Mira Award

Indianapolis-based TechPoint unveiled the nominees for its 2021 Mira Awards, honoring the "Best in Tech in Indiana." Franklin College has announced the appointment of Andrew Rosner as director of digital fluency at the college. Digital fluency is the aptitude to effectively and ethically interpret information, discover meaning, design content, construct knowledge, and communicate ideas in a digitally connected world. Franklin College is ramping up its efforts in digital fluency to better prepare its students for the workforce after graduation. Rosner, the first ever to hold the position at the college, is responsible for leading the implementation of the college's strategic digital fluency initiative. His primary role is establishing connections to people knowledge and experiences in digital fluency that will enhance the strong liberal arts education at Franklin and improve students'

digital fluency skills and career outcomes. Rosner comes to the college from the Mark Cuban Center for Sports Media and Technology at Indiana University where he served as its director since 2015. He is also the owner of Everlong Digital, a firm that develops digital marketing strategies for small businesses, and educates and coaches clients on strategic digital marketing and social media tools.


