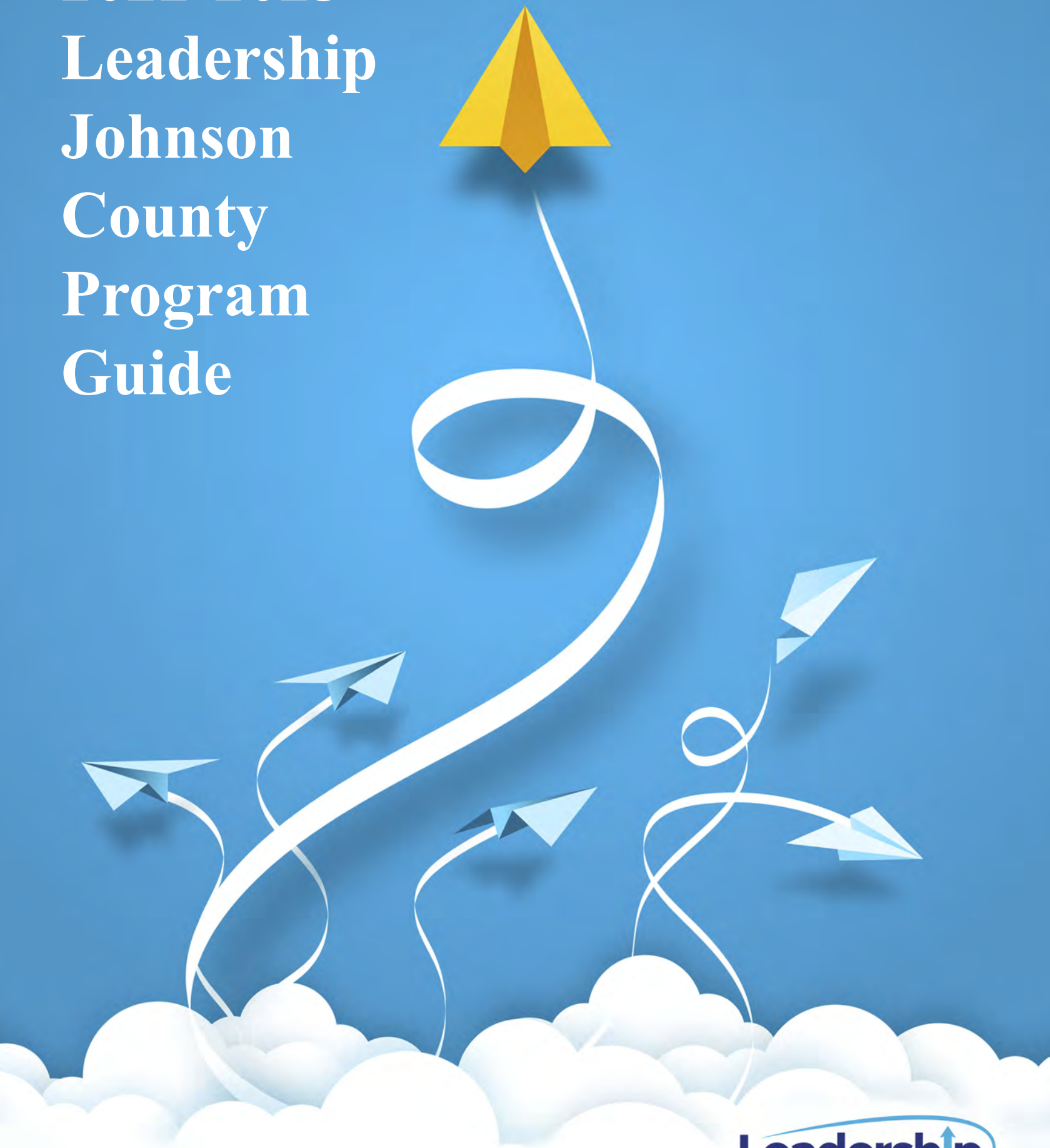

- Enact their leadership style in a variety of situations

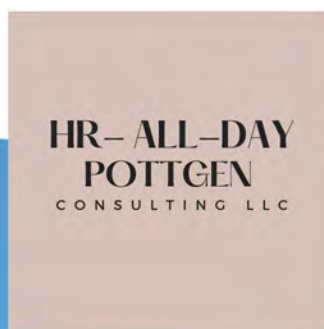


About the Facilitator

Melinda Messineo will guide participants through their personalized diversity story as they build their understanding about the connections between implicit bias and microaggressions. Attendees will leave the session with skills they can use immediately to reduce the frequency of microaggressions. They will also develop strategies for moving toward recovery and repair when microaggressions do occur.

At the end of this session participants will:

- Understand our personal diversity stories
- Explore how differences in how we read stories impacts others
- Anticipate causes of implicit bias and microaggressions
- Practice strategies to move toward recovery and repair when mistakes occur

Dr. Melinda Messineo is a professor of sociology at Ball State University and an inclusive excellence advocate and nationally recognized trainer. She has twice served as Interim Associate Vice President for Inclusive Excellence and as a Distinguished Faculty fellow. Mauksch Award from the American Sociological Association Section on Teaching and Learning. In Robert Greenleaf's essay, "The Servant as Leader," he articulated a philosophy of leadership quite different from the many "great man/woman" models of leading. One aspect of this philosophy was the notion of "healing." Even before Covid, news reports were rife with stories of struggles and tensions that many people were facing.... much contributed to by the organization(s) they work in. What does helping people and (by extension) organizations to "heal" have to do with effective leadership? What is the role of a leader in addressing the "daily paper cuts" of organizational life with their associates, themselves, and the overall integrity of their organization?

- Identify sources of stressors and concerns
- Identify strategies in addressing stressors and concerns
- Identify and list specific practices that can be developed and used to enhance and strengthen individual and organizational resilience

He currently teaches classes in the Doctoral Program in Interdisciplinary Leadership at Creighton University and the Greenleaf Center for Servant Leadership Academy. In this workshop, we will explore contemporary aspects of leadership in the midst of organizational diversity, change, and complexity. Diversity, equity and inclusion will be discussed through theory, practical tools and strategies. The social context and psychological processes that result in implicit bias, discrimination, and marginalization will be discussed. Participants will become more self-aware and become familiar with ways of becoming more culturally proficient. Contemporary leadership styles will be examined to inspire and shape participants to adopt models for change that remove systemic obstacles and facilitate growth and achievement.

At the end of this session participants will:

- Articulate the importance of diversity, equity and inclusion within organizations and institutions
- Establish plans to integrate strategies to make the workplace a more inclusive environment
- Realize the importance of identifying personal views, values, perceptions, implicit, and conscious and unconscious biases in order to create more inclusive environments
- Explain the importance for leaders to be conscious of their own culture, and the culture of others

Gary Chapman's book *The Five Love Languages* was originally written for married couples, and then adapted for parents. But the principles it teaches are highly versatile, and can improve communication in virtually any setting, including our workplaces. Most of us know how we want to be affirmed, but not everyone processes information or emotions in the same ways. Understanding how others express – and prefer to receive – feedback and appreciation enables us to more effectively encourage and motivate a broader cross-section of people.

Conversation is not just about what is being said, it's also listening to what is being said. About 50-75% of our daily communication time is spent listening, yet somehow, we are never taught to effectively listen. Format: Ten sessions are held, starting in September with a two-day retreat, followed by a monthly meeting on the second Wednesday of each month, October through May. The Leadership Johnson County staff facilitates this program with the help of more than 100 guest speakers.

Location: Sessions held at Franklin College and locations around Johnson County.

Cost: \$1,750 per person, scholarships available.

The Leadership Johnson County Signature Program is a nine-month program composed of one-day leadership forums designed to train and strengthen 21st century leaders. The program curriculum integrates leadership skills training and community awareness into each day.

KNOWLEDGE OF COMMUNITY

- Gain a deeper understanding of the history, industry, agriculture and organizations in our community
- Understand better the challenges and opportunities we face in Johnson County
- Learn about available resources to tackle those challenges and opportunities

- Discuss and learn about a variety of leadership theories and definitions
- Create a personal leadership definition
- Practice specific leadership skills to work more effectively in our community and workplaces

- Exercise those skills through a real-world community project of the team's own selection and design



BUILD RELATIONSHIPS AND NETWORKS

- Get to know class members and build strong relationships through a variety of experiential learning activities

PERSONAL LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- Grow in self-awareness and awareness of others through the Myers-Briggs Type Indicator self-assessment
- Gain personal leadership skills and individual confidence in leadership aptitude and strengths

Community awareness course topics include: Building Community, Agriculture, Infrastructure, Economic Development, Media Relations, Social Services & Healthcare, Quality of Life and Government.

The Signature Program is ideal for anyone who is interested in developing leadership skills, learning more about community and creating positive change in Johnson County.

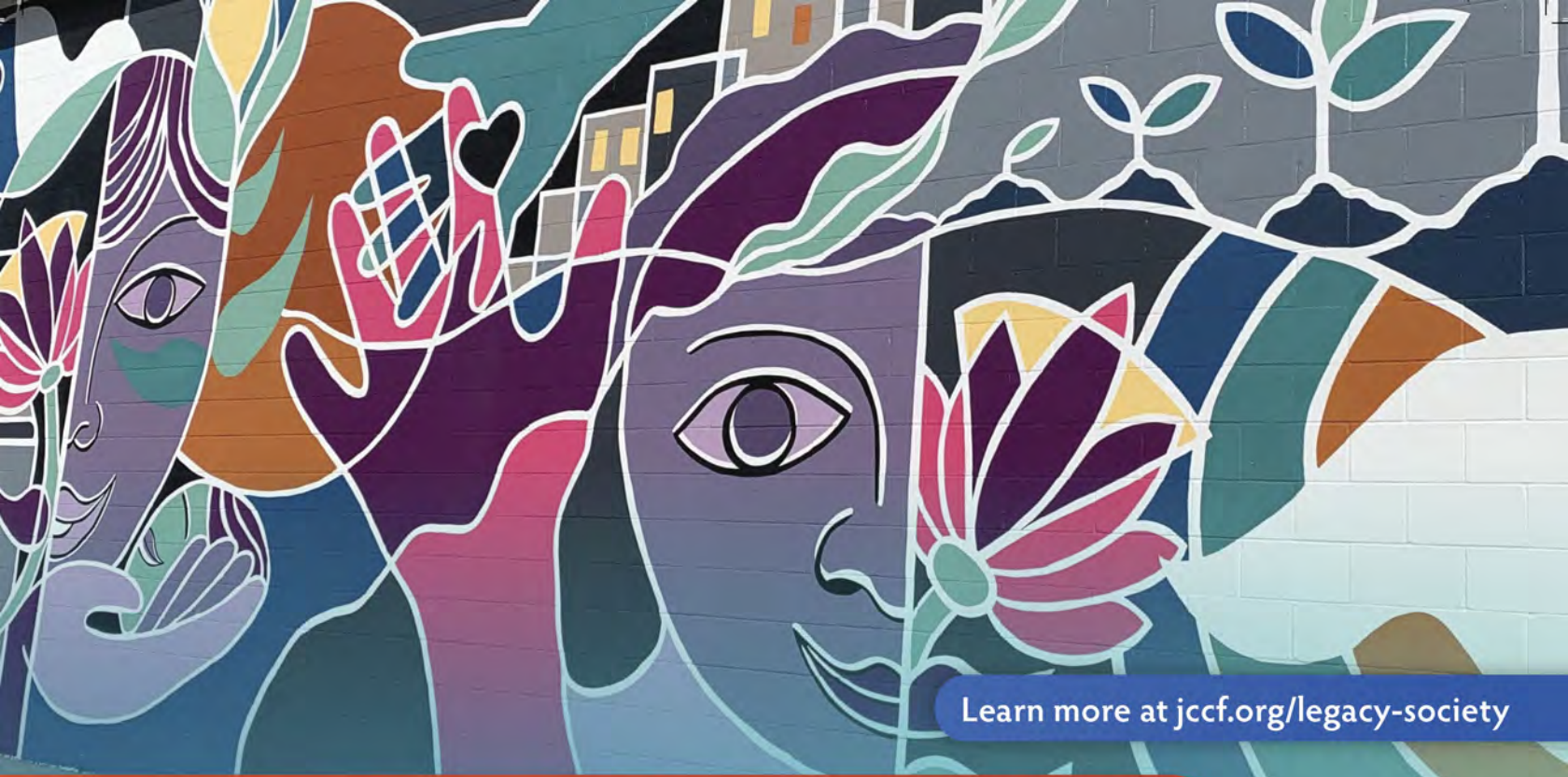
