



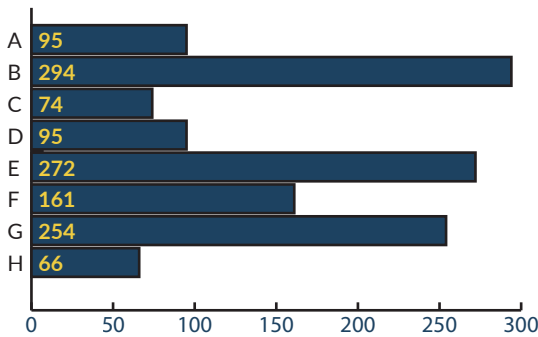

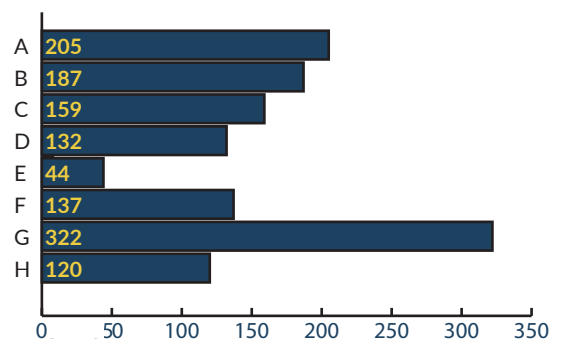

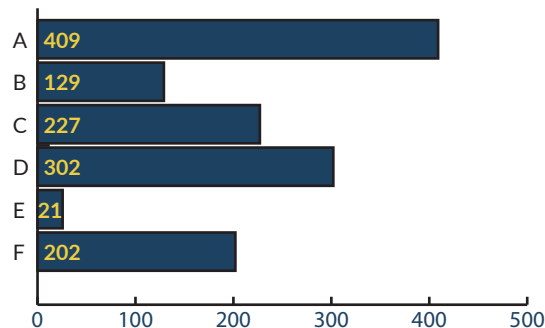

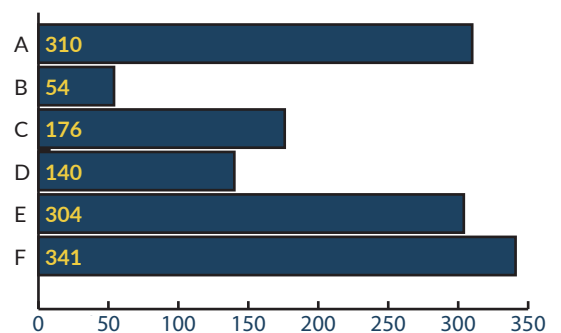

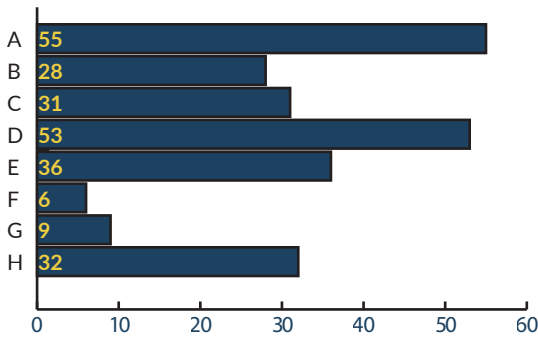

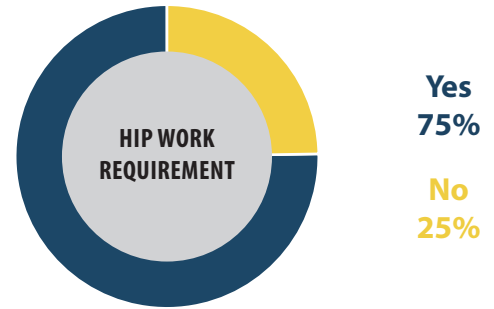
5. Which one of the following do you believe would do the most to improve Indiana's economy?

IMPROVE ECONOMY

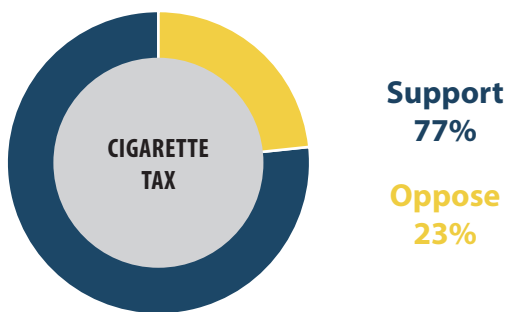

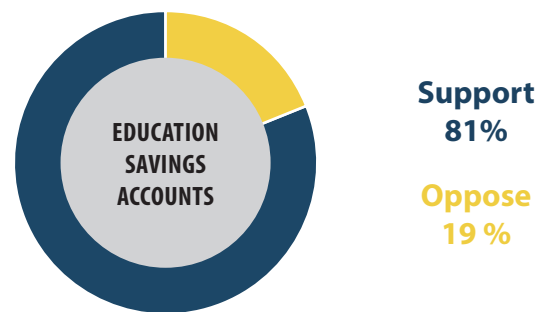
6. Should Indiana require able-bodied adults to work or look for work in order to receive publicly funded health care coverage under the Healthy Indiana Plan?

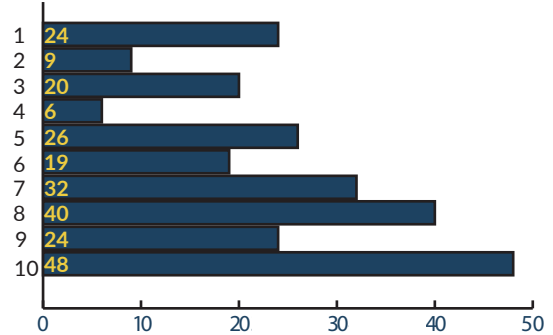

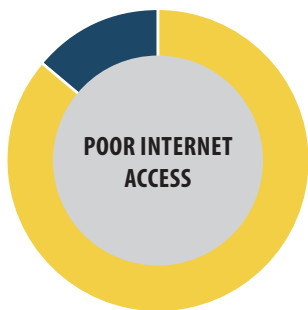

STATE INVOLVEMENT WITH INTERNET ACCESS



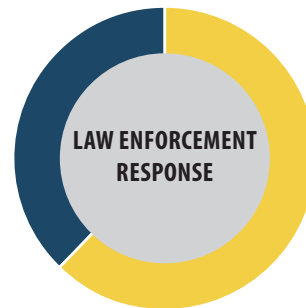
16. Do you currently struggle with internet access or bandwidth?
