



This week's theme is Pokémon!

Pokémon Training

Supplies: Pokémon Action Cards, Props (optional)

Instructions

1. Create cards that recreate some of the Pokémon character's attacks or moves, if you have a Pokedex this can be a lot of fun and keep them entertained for a good hour.

- 2. Once you have the cards created you can play this in a variety of ways:
 - a. Pokemon Trainer Says (Simon Says)
 - b. Charades
 - c. Battle Style (For the more advanced Pokémon players)
 - d. Let them create their own game

Pokémon Planter

Supplies: Plastic soda bottle, sharpie, scissors, pencil, acrylic paint, paint brush, paper, glue

Instructions

- 1. Wash, clean, and dry your bottle. Determine your desired height for planter, use a marker to trace the ears and top of head at determined height.
- 2. Using scissors cut out along traced line. (An adult should do this step)
- 3. Prepare the paint for your planter. (I mixed green and white to get the shade I desired for Bulbasaur) Paint the entire outer surface of the bottle, you may need to use more than one coat of paint for your desired look.
- 4. While this is drying. Draw and color the eyes and other desired features on white paper. (This is easier than drawing/painting on a curved surface.
- 5. Once the bottle is completely dry glue the paper features to the bottle.
- 6. Then you can use a sharple to draw any remaining features on such as a mouth, eyebrows, etc.
- 7. Finally fill with soil and your favorite plant.

Pokémon Pencil Holder

Supplies: Empty and clean tin can, colored paper, white paper, pencils, markers, scissors, tape

Instructions

- 1. Start by measuring and cutting your colored paper for the tin. Make sure it is high enough and long enough to wrap around the tin once plus a little extra.
- 2. Draw and color the Pokémon features on the white paper. Cut out features. (eyes, mouth)

- 3. Glue these to the colored paper. Add any additional details in black marker such as nostrils or eye brows.
- 4. Tape paper to your tin.
- 5. Place pencils, markers, crayons, or any of your favorite writing utensils!

Pokémon Challenge!

Supplies: Only items from your house
