Franklin College Offers Free Data Analysis to Local Nonprofits Through Mathematics Course

Does your organization need data for decision-making, grant writing, or reporting purposes? Do you have data that you would like to have compiled and analyzed? For sixteen years, Franklin College has partnered with local non-profit agencies through a course, Statistical Consulting Project, in which teams of senior and junior mathematics majors and minors, as well as some psychology majors and economics majors, perform semester-long consulting projects at no cost. Recent clients include Johnson County Community Foundation, Access Johnson County, and Habitat for Humanity, and government agencies such as the Johnson County Alternative Dispute Resolution project and Johnson County Corrections. Projects are selected based on scope and match with student capabilities, and will run from mid-February through early May.
