Learning Objectives: Earth-Moon-Sun Systems 6.ESS.1, 6.ESS.2, 6.ESS.3

Start looking at other bodies in space besides the planets: asteroids, meteoroid, meteors, etc. Begin studying notes for the solar system test before Thanksgiving This week students are at labs making models of how far planets are from the sun and the diameter of the planets.
