



That's where DeKalb Health's continuum of care comes into play. From our first touch with patients at preadmission check in, to the last physical therapy session, DeKalb Health is able to provide a comprehensive orthopedic care experience close to home, and all under one roof.



SURGERY

Our orthopedic surgical specialists are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week. While a hospital stay may be required in some cases, many of our surgical procedures are available on an outpatient basis. Our surgical staff works closely with DeKalb Health team members in the Med Surg Inpatient Unit, the Surgery Recovery Unit, Home Health Care and with the specialist in pain management and infection control to make each patient's stay as safe and comfortable as possible.



PAIN MANAGEMENT

To say there can be pain associated with orthopedic care is an understatement. For many patients, pain is a very real part of orthopedic conditions, treatment and recovery.

Fortunately, DeKalb Health offers pain management and physiatry options, and is the only hospital in the northeast region currently utilizing pain ball, specialized nerve blocks for pain management. When used by our fellowship-trained orthopedic surgeons, this proven technique has been shown to decrease narcotic consumption and help patients manage pain in a safer, lower-risk way. Deployed with a team approach between the orthopedic surgeon and anesthesiologist, this strategy allows for better recovery, and quicker overall recuperation.



PHARMACY

PharmaCare is a full-service retail pharmacy, featuring over-the-counter items, vitamins and natural supplements, orthopedic supports and breast feeding supplies. DeKalb Health PharmaCare also offers prescription compounding and customized medications for those seeking to avoid sugar, preservatives, dye or lactose. For those that don't like the taste of their medicine, the pharmacists can flavor pediatric and other liquid medications, even compounding veterinary medications to meet your pet's needs.

DeKalb Health PharmaCare accepts e-prescriptions from area providers and offers even more convenience in the form of free prescription delivery to the Auburn, Garrett and Waterloo areas. PHYSICAL THERAPY


DeKalb Health's Physical and Occupational Rehabilitation Services is one of its busiest departments. It saw nearly a 40 percent growth in visits between 2009 and 2013 alone.

Since its opening in 2015, the new DeKalb Health Rehabilitation Center has allowed this busy department to help DeKalb Health meet the current patient recovery needs, and to keep pace with expected growth in this segment in the future. The North Campus facility includes treatment and diagnostic areas for both physical and occupational therapy and dedicated expertise for orthopedic care.

Easy access to these services is critical to patients recovering from orthopedic surgery or injury. Physical and occupational therapy helps these people regain or improve their physical functions, or overcome problems with movement as a result of sports injuries, accidents, strokes or other movement disorders. Whether it's joint and muscle movement or tasks like getting out of bed and walking, DeKalb Health's team of physical therapists and physical therapy assistants concentrate on helping our patients regain mobility and perform tasks again.

DeKalb Health Rehabilitation is available at the DeKalb Health campus in Auburn Monday through Friday or in Garrett at the Judy A. Morrill (JAM) Center on Tuesdays and Thursdays. 
Health Risk Appraisals

MY ORTHOPEDIC EXPERIENCE

I was born and raised in Auburn, and I have always trusted the awesome professionals associated with DeKalb Health. When I first saw him for knee replacement surgery, I was well over 300 pounds. He stated to me he would not do the surgery because it was far too risky for a woman of my height and weight, and said I had

to lose weight before he could help me. I have to admit I cried. I felt so defeated and so discouraged, and felt there was no hope for me.

I went home that night defeated, but thought about everything he said to me. I put myself on a strict diet and I lost more than 40 pounds. When I returned to see him, Dr. Hanna was so proud of me, he made a point of making me feel special. He stepped out of the office and he told the entire staff about my weight loss—and set up the surgery.

I have since lost over 70 pounds. Losing the weight helped my healing progress tremendously. I am able to walk better, stand straighter and do more things. I honestly feel I owe Dr. Hanna for giving me that wake-up call I needed. Trust me, whoever reads this, YOU CAN DO IT—you just have to have faith and determination to see it through.

I have a beautiful grandson that was born on March 18, 2016. When he was two weeks old, I saw the doctor again to set up a hip replacement surgery. I told him I had to be able to take care of my grandson and

be able to walk him to the park, so we had to get this done now! I had the surgery on May 31, and am doing great. I received the anterior approach for hip replacement surgery. Many people don't know that this can be done at DeKalb Health. I'm looking forward to watching my grandson and living a full life again. Thank you, Dr. Hanna, for being the one I needed to see and needed to hear.

As far as the staff at DeKalb Health, I have to say I was treated so well throughout the entire process. A month after my knee replacement surgery, I developed a bowel blockage, and had to be admitted to the hospital. I have never seen such awesome nurses as the ones that took care of me—they went far and beyond the call of duty to show caring and compassion. Thank you to all the staff who cared for me from the beginning of my surgeries through the end of the surgeries, the therapy department, the surgical department and the after care—what awesome people you all are and thank you DeKalb Health for everything you did for me. More importantly, thank you for making me feel special and showing that you cared.
