#### TRANSFORMING OUR COMMUNITY



the fall of 2021, a dramatic transformation took place in the alley between MCCF and Milligan's Flowers and Gifts. Located in the heart of downtown, this alley has lots of daily foot traffic, and is also a popular spot for senior photos. After seven days and seventy hours of labor, this nondescript brick wall became an eye-catching canvas of color with its striking display of vibrant flowers.

The idea for Alley Art was formed when "Love Where you Live" author Peter Kageyama visited Montgomery County in 2018. He led an exercise with some local residents to brainstorm projects to enhance our community, which led to a conversation about bringing art to historic downtown Crawfordsville. Eventually, through a grant from the Wabash Heartland Innovation Network to the Tippecanoe Arts Federation, and an MCCF grant, the idea became a reality.

The artist, Jenna Morello, is a muralist from Brooklyn, New York, and her work is featured all over the country. As Jenna's artwork grew, so did the number of people who stopped by. She was overwhelmed by the friendly, welcoming manner of our citizens. Though she often worked until dark, she still found time to engage with preschool groups, college students, and curiosity seekers alike.

We are truly thankful Jenna brought her unique talent here and forever transformed a piece of downtown Crawfordsville. And we are so proud of our wonderful community for their warm embrace of Jenna and her art.





#### **ENHANCING EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION**



HIGH quality child care and early childhood education remains a top concern and priority in our community. In 2021, the Early Childhood Coalition, an initiative of MCCF, formed and a five-year strategic plan developed to address these concerns. The MCCF identified work in this area as a top strategic initiative, and this past summer, Lisa Walter joined our staff as Early Learning Director. Lisa has extensive experience in the early education field, and is passionate about high quality early childhood education. She hit the ground running, and we are thrilled to have her lead this important initiative for our community.

From her first day, Lisa considered building relationships with our established early childhood providers as a top priority. She toured their facilities and observed their programs, which provided her with invaluable information that helped her assess needs and available resources. Those relationships established great communication between Lisa and the providers, and she engages with them daily, offering support and encouragement.

The coalition hosted the first-ever Early Learning Expo for our local early childhood providers in September 2021. At this mini-conference, the providers received professional development training by Diane Pike from St. Mary's Child Center, along with resources, giveaways, and more.

Lisa said that the Expo was an eye-opening experience and highlighted the need for continued professional development dedicated to early childhood providers. The success of the Expo blossomed into a series of child care provider workshops, dozens of Montgomery County teachers pursuing Child Development Associate credentials, and multiple child care programs working together to achieve higher Paths to Quality ratings, and more.

We consider it an honor to collaborate with our local child care providers and support their vital work. Lisa is encouraged by their motivation and enthusiasm as they strive to improve the quality of care for our smallest of citizens. She said, "It is like a big hug across Montgomery County as our providers connect, learn from one another, and work hard to achieve high quality child care in our community."

EACH year, the three local school districts apply for and receive a grant from our competitive grant cycle to support their Health and Welfare funds. The school nurses use these funds to address medical, vision, and dental needs of students, along with emergency equipment and health education materials.



The need for this fund has only increased, especially since the pandemic. Sixty percent of students in the Crawfordsville Community School Corporation (CCSC) qualify for the federal free/reduced lunch program and textbook assistance. This percentage does not appear to be going down anytime soon, and this grant helps cover costs for a multitude of health services for families who do not have adequate resources. For example, younger students tend to break their glasses frequently, and poor vision can have a significant impact on school performance. Many of these students do not have insurance coverage. This grant allows the school to purchase glasses that the student can leave at school, providing an extra layer of support and protection.

Overall, the CCSC nurses are able to supply school clinics with emergency medications and supplies, such as AED pads, Epi pens, and Albuterol. In the high school and middle school, funds are used to pay for dental services not covered by insurance, or due to a lack of coverage. Sabrina Gatlin, school nurse at Hoover Elementary, is grateful for the MCCF grant because it allows the school to provide the students with Human Growth and Development Education. These programs no longer receive funding, yet are important for a student's overall health and well-being. Health education professionals provide age-appropriate lessons for students based on Indiana Standards for Health and Wellness.

Sabrina emphasized the important role nurses play in order for students to thrive at school by making sure their needs are met physically, mentally, and socially. She stated that the MCCF grant gives nurses the capabilities to do just that.





AFTER the death of a close friend, and some personal upheaval resulting in homelessness and separation from her son, Juifria became desperate to numb the pain. She lost hope and surrendered to despair. Though she had been sober for eight years, one weak moment and a bad choice later, Juifria began a descent into the dark world of heroin addiction. Her life quickly spiraled out of control, and the day came when the choices she made resulted in multiple arrest warrants. Oddly enough, upon her arrest, Juifria felt a sense of relief; she was tired, broken and defeated. At the time, Juifria could not have imagined she would not only begin to heal, but also learn how to live free of destructive behavior while behind bars. But she did.

Juifria was accepted into the Jail Chemical Addiction Program (JCAP). In this program, participants are separated from others in the jail population and expected to spend at least 90 days in cognitive behavioral therapy. Social workers conduct group and individual counseling. The goal of JCAP is to help addicted offenders leave jail on a path to recovery. JCAP is a correctional model that not only penalizes offenders for their crimes, but also improves their character by addressing social, emotional, spiritual, educational, and familial issues through targeted services. A key to long-term success is creating solid plans for continued treatment once participants complete their sentences. The Montgomery County JCAP for women launched in 2020 through a MCCF three-year grant. By the end of 2021, thirty-eight women enrolled in JCAP, with over 80% completing the program.

After Juifria completed JCAP, she needed a place to continue serving her sentence on home detention - or else she would go to prison. She applied and was accepted into Pam's Promise – a three-to-six-month nonprofit transitional housing program for homeless women and their children. The program encourages faith and family rebuilding as it works side by side with clients to teach life skills and provide the necessary tools to end homelessness. Women seeking transitional housing

assistance undergo an application and interview process and must meet certain criteria to qualify for the program. At Pam's Promise, Juifria found unconditional love and support, and a place that felt like home, which gave her hope. She set goals and worked hard to meet them, and eventually graduated from the program.

Today, Juifria is a manager of a local fast food establishment, lives on her own, and has reunited with her son. She stays in contact with her case manager and feels surrounded with solid support. Juifria knows she will continue to have challenges, as we all do, but believes she now has the tools and resources to face them. Juifria is so grateful for JCAP and Pam's Promise for giving her just what she needed at just the right time.

THE scenic and tranquil atmosphere surrounding Achaius Ranch provides a soothing respite for children struggling with anxiety, emotional, and/or behavioral issues. The ranch is located on 17 acres near Ladoga, Indiana, with facilities that include pastures, woods, barns, arenas, a picnic shelter, and more. Beautiful horses and a small menagerie that includes a pair of miniature donkeys, goats, potbellied pigs and more, fill the ranch. They currently offer trauma-informed programs, including a summer youth program, special group sessions in the spring and fall, field trips, and tours.

Youth programs are designed to meet the needs of children who have a history of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE). Some of the children who come to Achaius Ranch have experienced abuse or bullying, some have faced the death of a parent, and others struggle with a lack of self-confidence or worth. Regardless of the emotional and behavioral baggage a child may carry, the overarching belief of Achaius Ranch is that each child is completely worthy of love and acceptance. That central belief permeates their programs and activities, and they try to accommodate every child who desires to participate, provided the Ranch has the capacity and resources to do so.





Thanks to individual donors and grants, these programs and activities are currently free of charge. Achaius Ranch was delighted to receive a \$25,000 MCCF grant that will allow them to continue their Harmony Program; a program designed to help children grow and heal, build resilience in the face of adversity, and gain personal empowerment. They serve at least 150 children per year and continue to grow as needs and resources increase.

The equine assisted learning programs at Achaius Ranch have immense benefit to the child. There is something compelling about the beauty and gentleness of a horse, and children are generally openly curious and drawn to them. It does not take long for the child to connect with their horse, and that bond has a positive impact on the child. Elisha McCulloh, Founder, stated, "Teaching children to observe, understand, and learn from horses helps children gain competence and confidence in self-awareness, empathy, communication, leadership, and building relationships." But perhaps the greatest way to measure the benefit of this program is found in the following testimonial from one of the participants:

"I have been here for four years and counting because the atmosphere of healing and positivity that Achaius Ranch has offered me has made it into a very secure place for me. Since I started my journey here, I have learned how to trust, how to listen, how to speak kindly to myself and others, and how to love the world and God in ways that I never have before. Over the years I have faced many challenges, but knowing that I have a place to go every summer is a refreshing thought that helps me to think of all of the good things to come."



WHILE home on leave from Iraq, former MCCF scholarship recipient, Jacob Surface, stopped by our office last May for an unexpected but most welcome visit. He wanted to take the opportunity to thank MCCF, and by extension the community, for its investment in him as a student. Before stopping by, Jacob had lunch with his best friend and fellow Wabash College graduate, Jake Moore, and the two were reflecting on their tenyear anniversary college graduation. "Jake and I were talking about our jobs, specifically Jake's role as a former public defender and now a deputy prosecutor, and we kept coming back to how our families' and communities' investments in our education and development had come full circle with our careers in public service."

Jacob realized in high school that most of his male role models were Wabash alumni, and he was sure he wanted to be a Wabash man too. After his acceptance, Jacob wrestled with how he would ever be able to afford to attend the college. However, he received the support he needed through the MCCF Conover and Pattison scholarships,

as well as several Wabash scholarships. He stated that every scholarship he received was a vote of confidence in him. Because of these scholarships and working throughout college, Jacob graduated with less college debt than most of his peers.

Jacob first pursued an interest in law, but soon discovered that his passion lied in public service and public policy. He then began a different journey that led him to the career he has today. Jacob was sworn into service as a Foreign Service Officer in 2013, among the youngest in his class at the age of 24. His job as a Political Officer is to gather information by talking to local politicians and activists, through open source media and reports, and translate that into political analysis of the area to

those making policy decisions. His work has taken him from Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific to Saudi Arabia and Afghanistan. As of July 2020, Jacob began a tour at the U.S. Embassy in Iraq, and in spite of the turmoil around him, he feels very safe and enjoys his work immensely while thriving under the pressure. Jacob will join his wife, Lana, who is also in the Foreign Service, in Egypt when his post ends in Iraq in 2022.

Jacob learned many of the skills he employs today in his career through his volunteer efforts as a teenager at the Youth Service Bureau, and he strongly believes it is important to be involved and invested in your community at an early age. Jacob recalled participating in grant review panels at the YSB and arguing cases at Teen Court – both skill sets he employs today advocating for policy positions and reviewing millions of dollars in grant proposals.

On his breaks, Jacob comes back home to work on his grandparent's former Christmas tree farm, and visit friends, family, local schools, and mentors who inspired him throughout his education and personal development. Jacob plans to maintain his roots here when he retires from the Foreign Service, and to continue teaching and volunteering in the community where it all began. We are grateful for Jacob's service to our country, and look forward to the day he and his wife will come back home.

# WHY NOT FOREVER?

THE POWER OF A BEQUEST



We all desire significance—to lead happy and fulfilled lives surrounded by family and friends.

There is a compelling need to make a difference – to leave a lasting impact on the people most dear to us and the world in which we live. The search for significance and desire to plan for the future leads many to ponder their legacy. What kind of legacy will you leave? A bequest is perhaps the easiest and most tangible way to have a lasting impact on the people and organizations that mean the most to you. A bequest may also be an effective way to make a gift to charity and lessen the burden of taxes on your family and estate.

#### An Easy Gift to Make

A charitable bequest is a bequest written in a will or trust that directs a gift to be made to a qualified exempt charity when you pass away. One benefit of a charitable bequest is that it enables you to further the good work of an organization you support long after you are gone. Better yet, a charitable bequest can help you save estate taxes by providing your estate with a charitable deduction for the value of the gift. With careful planning, your family can also avoid paying income taxes on the assets they receive from your estate.

# What Legacy Will You Leave?

A bequest is one of the easiest gifts to make. With the help of an advisor, you can include language in your will or trust specifying a gift to be made to family, friends or charity as part of your estate plan.

- Gift of a percentage of your estate
- Gift of a specific asset
- Gift of the residue of your estate

Certain types of property pass outside of a will or trust. These assets require that you name a beneficiary by completing a beneficiary designation form. To make a bequest of these assets, you should contact the company or entity from which you purchased the asset. Below are a couple of examples:

#### Bequest of an IRA

A retirement asset like an IRA account makes an excellent beguest to charity. If the IRA were given to your family, much of the value would be depleted through estate and income taxes. By designating charity as the beneficiary of part or all of your IRA, the full value of the gift is transferred tax free at your death and your estate receives a charitable deduction. If you wish to leave your IRA to your spouse at your death, you may also designate charity as the secondary beneficiary of your account. Contact your IRA or retirement account custodian to obtain a beneficiary designation form and make a bequest from your IRA.

#### Bequest of Insurance Policy

An insurance policy makes a nice bequest to charity. As an asset of your estate, an insurance policy is taxable at your death. However, if the policy is gifted to charity, your estate avoids paying tax on the value of the policy and receives a charitable deduction for the gift. You may generally name anyone as beneficiary of your insurance policy and change your designation at anytime. Contact your insurance company to obtain a beneficiary designation form and make a bequest of your policy to charity.


#### The Dusk to Dawn Bereavement Fund


#### The Ron Eden Fund



In 1962, Ron and Sharon Eden moved to Montgomery County after Ron accepted an engineering position at R. R. Donnelleys. This small, friendly, farming community reminded them of their home in Iowa, so they settled here and raised a family. Ron eventually pursued other business interests, owning and operating Cville Bowling Lanes and the Holiday Inn for many years. His career in business fit perfectly with his outgoing personality – he enjoyed getting to know people and helping them. His employees knew him as an approachable boss, someone they could go to for advice or support. His family shared that he took pride in serving this community, and did so with honesty, integrity, and hard work. Ron was also an avid racer. He raced Sprint and Midget cars all over the country, winning numerous features and a few championships. He loved living life in the fast lane and even passed his passion for racing along to his daughter, Sondi Eden, who established her own racing career. Interestingly, Ron passed away in 2016 during the Indy 500 weekend. His family established this unrestricted fund in his memory to benefit the community as a whole, knowing that Ron would wholeheartedly approve.

#### The Martin and Areta Siamas Kaitson Fund

When Jane Kaitson Cooley and her brother, E. Chris Kaitson, learned about the MCCF fund that their Uncle Tom Siamas established in memory of his brother, John Siamas, they were inspired to do something similar. They desired to honor their parents, Martin and Areta Siamas Kaitson, who adopted Jane and Chris, biological siblings, from Greece. Jane and Chris said that their parents gave tirelessly of themselves to their family, their community, and their church. Martin and Areta were well known in this community as they farmed, worked at Coney Island (former site was on the southeast corner at the intersection of Market & Washington Streets), and owned and operated Shoppers Mart and Hatfield Furniture. After Martin's death in 1974, Areta found purpose in life as the site director at Northside Nutrition Center, and served as an officer for Area IV Agency on Aging. She passed away in 1989 after a battle with cancer. This fund will provide support to the Youth Service Bureau, and will honor their memory for years to come.





#### The Schoen Family Fund

Though he no longer lives in Montgomery County, Ronald Schoen continues to give back to the place he considers home. He grew up on a farm near Darlington in the 1950s and 1960s and said that it was an extraordinary time and place. Ronald humbly credits any success in his life to his family, teachers, and the entire community. With this debt of gratitude in mind, he established the Schoen Family Fund as a way of giving back. The fund will provide support to the Darlington Forever Inc., which benefits the town of Darlington, Indiana. At some future time, he would like to add another area of support that would enhance Montgomery County as a place where people can lead flourishing lives. Ronald is retired as the CFO of a commercial insurance provider.

#### Solar Power to the People (in Nonprofits, Churches and Others) Fund

Marc and Helen Hudson are no strangers to philanthropic endeavors in our community. Their involvement and impact is extensive, and includes the areas of environmental cleanup and preservation, culinary arts, local history, and political advocacy. Drawing inspiration from other local environmental efforts, Marc and Helen decided to establish this fund as a way to encourage and help others to move toward alternative energies, and thus lighten the carbon footprint in our county. The Solar Power to the People Fund will provide support to encourage nonprofits and other groups not publicly funded to be able to pursue best clean energy practices in the 21st century. The fund primarily encourages converting non-profit organizations' buildings to solar energy. Though Marc and Helen are retired from their respective careers, it would be hard to define either of them as "retired" since they continue to volunteer much time and effort to make Montgomery County an even better place for all of us.



#### The Kathleen J. Steele Park Fund



Established by an anonymous donor, this fund will provide support to the City of Crawfordsville to maintain the Kathleen J. Steele Park located in the 800 block of West Main Street. This park on the northwest side of Crawfordsville was completely redesigned and renovated in 2021. It is named after Dr. Kathy Steele, former superintendent of Crawfordsville Community Schools. Filled with colorful new playground equipment, as well as areas to just sit and relax, the park is a bright spot for this neighborhood and the community in general. ## Does my Community really need an Endowment?

At the heart of the mission of the MCCF is building endowment to secure the future of Montgomery County. We understand the power of permanence. We believe that it's the key to ensuring that our community's future will be even brighter than its past. When you create an endowed fund through the MCCF, you can benefit the community forever.

## Why Give to an Endowment?

You are part of this community's past and present. By creating an endowed fund with the MCCF, you have the opportunity to make a difference during your lifetime, and also provide for the community you care about for generations to come. As needs, opportunities, and the nonprofits that address them change over time, your wishes are preserved and grants continue to make life better in the name of the fund you establish.

#### How does an Endowment work?

Your endowment is invested with our larger pool of assets which can lead to greater growth, greater income, and lower investment fees. We handle all the administrative details and issue grants to charities in the name of the fund you establish.

Generally, donors to endowments are those who want to ensure the future of their community. Most endowment gifts are "planned" and donors use such charitable vehicles as bequests, trusts, life insurance policies and retirement accounts.

Whatever the gift, donors make it with the intention of having it prudently invested and protected for the future. When the foundation accepts an endowment gift, the foundation promises the donor that their wishes will be observed.

Below is a breakdown of how a gift given three different ways can impact an organization:


