RESOLVED, that the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) should lobby to allow noncorporate taxpayers (independent FP offices) to deduct the lesser-combined QBI taxable income over net capital gain and this should be fair, equitable, and simple with minimal compliance costs and effective government administration.
