2
3 **RESOLUTION 22-01: SUPERVISED CONSUMPTION SITES**

4 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) acquire information about
5 supervised consumption sites to distribute to the IAFP membership.

6 **Assigned to:** *Commission on Legislation*

7 **Action Taken:** *The IAFP has worked on gathering information on this topic with the help of the AAFP*
8 *and fellow state chapters.*

10 **RESOLUTION 22-03: IAFP POLICY ON ABORTION**

11 RESOLVED, the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians advocates for the well-being of all women and
12 children and supports legislation that does the same, and be it further

13 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) oppose any legislative efforts to
14 criminalize self-managed abortions and the criminalization of patients who access abortions, and be it
15 further

16 RESOLVED, the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) opposes the criminalization of
17 evidence-based healthcare, and opposes interference in the patient-physician relationship, including
18 gathering evidence for prosecution rather than providing treatment, and be it further

19 RESOLVED, in an effort to be inclusive of the diverse opinions and beliefs of all our membership, the
20 Indiana Academy of Family Physicians adopt a neutral policy on the topic of abortion, and be it further

21 RESOLVED, that in the case of a state-wide abortion ban, the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians
22 (IAFP) supports the inclusion of language with exemptions for substantial dangers to maternal health
23 or life, rape, incest, extrauterine pregnancy, and genetic mutations or fetal anomalies incompatible with
24 life as determined by medical experts.

31 **RESOLUTION 22-04: Qualified Business Income (QBI) Improvements for Independent Family**
32 **Physicians**

33 RESOLVED, that the American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP) should lobby to allow
34 noncorporate taxpayers (independent FP offices) to deduct the lesser-combined QBI taxable income
35 over net capital gain and this should be fair, equitable, and simple with minimal compliance costs and
36 effective government administration. Current tax code needs to remove the current difference in
37 treatment of specified service trades or business SSTBs (primary independent medical practices are
38 one example). This would allow us to qualify for the deduction. Current law denies the QBI deduction.

42 **RESOLUTION 22-08: Equal pay for family medicine procedures**

46 American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP).
