Learning Objectives: Understanding the periodic table and atomic structure 8.PS.1 Students will read the history behind the periodic table and begin to dissect the sections and elements that make up the periodic table. That information will be used to classify and identify elements. Then, models will be used to describe how each element's atomic structure differs. Students will complete will begin to dissect the periodic table and how it is organized first by taking notes then by color coding their own table along with lab activities to reinforce the organization of the grid. Students check in and warm up in the choir room at 6:15 p.m. Students need to wear their choir shirts and jeans. If a student has lost or outgrown their shirt, I have these for \$15.

6th Grade has rotated to their new 6 week enrichment class. I have enjoyed this first group and will look forward to seeing some of them in choir 2nd semester. My new group is very spirited and not a quiet bunch, but in music class that is often a good thing! We will send out a form for them to list their top enrichment choices in November or December and then extend invitations to students to participate in band or choir or both. All students must be able to match pitch and attend required concerts if they are placed in choir.

Mr. Hardy – Band-6th Grade General Music: This is the second week with the next rotation of 6th grade General Music students. Each week, the 6th grade general music students will be introduced to each instrument they can sign-up to play next semester for 6th Grade Band. This week we have been discussing the instrument families: strings, brass, woodwinds, and percussion. We have also been talking about our first instrument, the flute. Students spent the week trying out the instrument and using

the same playing technique to make sounds on an empty plastic bottle. Each Friday we will be playing percussion instruments, working on repeating rhythms, and keeping a steady beat.

7th and 8th Grade Band: The members of the 7th and 8th Grade Band have been working hard over the past several class periods. We start out each class period with our concert B-flat exercises, making sure we *always* are playing with a good sound. We have began reading music out of our new band book, "Standard of Excellence" (Book 1 for 7th grade and Book 2 for 8th grade). **Students should be practicing every day!** In order to improve on our instruments, we must spend time outside of class working on the music we have been rehearsing during class.

Our first concert for the 2019-2020 school year will be on December 11. Please mark your calendars now!
