VII. Report of the Reference Committee

The speaker called for the report of reference committee.

- A. Dr. Jason Marker explained the consent calendar process. Members who disagree with the reference committee's decision should come to the microphone and request that an item be extracted from the reference committee report
- B. Dr. Marker presented the report of reference committee.
 - 1. It was requested that the following items be extracted from the consent calendar: Items 2, 3, 7, and 8
 - a. Item 2- #16-02 on "Reducing BAC to 0.05%"
 - b. Item 3- #16-03 on "Opioid Continuing Medical Education"
 - c. Item 7- #16-06 on "Reducing Tobacco Use and Harms Requires Raising Tobacco Tax Rates"
 - d. Item 8 Recommendation from the Commission on Legislation
 - 2. The speaker called for a motion to approve the report of the reference committee, with Item #2, 3, 7, 8 extracted. **There was a motion. Seconded and adopted.**
- C. Dr. Marker read Item 2 #16-02 on "Reducing BAC to 0.05%".
 - 1. Testimony was heard during the reference committee both in favor and in opposition of this resolution. There was discussion regarding the policy of the American Academy of Family Physicians on lowering the maximum blood alcohol concentration. Concerns were raised regarding the burden of the requirement to actively seek legislation and a recommendation was made to support future legislation, in addition to initiating discussions with stakeholders.
 - 2. Testimony was heard from the delegates about the extracted item.
 - 3. There was a motion to vote on Item 2 as recommended by the reference committee. Seconded and adopted.
- D. Dr. Marker read Item 3 #16-03 on "Opioid Continuing Medical Education"
 - Testimony was heard during the reference committee mainly in support of this
 resolution. A suggestion was made to remove the requirement to seek separate
 licensure for opioid prescribing, and instead to support the promotion of mandatory
 continuing medical education on opioid prescribing.
 - 2. Testimony was heard from the delegates about the extracted item.
 - 3. There was a motion to vote on Item 3 as recommended by the reference committee and to refer Item 3 directly to the Board of Directors to give direction on the promotion of mandatory CME training on opioid prescribing. Seconded and adopted.
- E. Dr. Marker read Item 7 #16-06 on " Reducing Tobacco Use and Harms Requires Raising Tobacco Tax Rates"
 - 1. Testimony was heard during the reference committee in favor of this resolution. Only minor amendments were made for clarification purposes.
 - Testimony was heard from the delegates about the extracted item. A
 recommendation was made to direct the IAFP to support, rather than seek, legislation
 that creates tax parity on rates on all other tobacco products. A recommendation was
 made to direct all, rather than a portion of, tobacco tax revenues toward state
 tobacco prevention programs.
 - 3. There was a motion to amend Resolution #16-06 as recommended by the reference committee to incorporate the changes suggested by the delegates. Seconded and adopted.
 - 4. There was a motion to vote on Resolution #16-06 as amended. Seconded and adopted.

1 F. Dr. Marker read Item 8 - Recommendation from the Commission on Legislation. 2 There was no opposition to this resolution during the reference committee. The 3 Chairman-Elect of the Board of Directors committed to addressing this issue at an upcoming meeting of the Board of Directors, which was agreeable to the author of 4 5 the resolution. 2. Testimony was heard from delegates about the extracted item. A suggestion was 6 7 made to change the directive to the Board of Directors to establish, rather than 8 discussing the creation of, a new decision-making process a new process. 9 3. There was a motion to amend the recommendation from the Commission on 10 <u>Legislation to incorporate the amendment suggested by the delegates.</u> 11 Seconded and adopted.
