Jerry Lindsey



Jerry is a member of the LJC Class of 2003, which he claims is the Smartest Class Ever! Jerry said that his experience in LJC opened his eyes to many new things in Johnson County. He also appreciated connecting with other community members and the meaningful conversations he had in LJC. Jerry has stayed connected with LJC by volunteering with the Signature Program Economic Development Day for many years.

Jerry grew up in Johnson County and graduated from Clark High School. Afterward, Jerry attended Franklin College where he took a Physical Science class that sparked his interest in weather. He then joined the Army and completed Meteorology training. While doing research in Puerto Rico, he met and married his wife Venus, and they spent 54 wonderful years together.

After the Army, Jerry worked in the Aerospace Services Division of Pan American World Airways for nine and a half years where he was stationed at many islands in the Caribbean and provided meteorological support for the Department of Defense and NASA launches in Cape Canaveral, Florida. Jerry was involved in the launches of Mercury, Gemini, and Apollo spacecraft and he is proud to have been a pioneer in the aerospace program. Jerry says that one of his greatest contributions was helping to put a man on the moon and bringing him home safely.

In 1971, Jerry began a long career with the National Weather Service that took him to Illinois, Ohio, and Indiana. During that time, he also earned a degree in Natural Sciences from the University of Cincinnati. He retired in 1998 after 30 years of federal service. Jerry stays active in weather by volunteering as a cooperative weather observer and sending daily reports to the National Weather Service regarding local temperature and precipitation.

His advice for those of us who are nearing or are in retirement? "Have something you love to do and keep doing it." For Jerry, that means staying in touch and visiting with family, friends, and coworkers. He enjoys spending time with his three children and their families in Ohio. Jerry can also be found walking every weekday morning at Johnson Memorial Health where he has become a familiar face with many staff. In addition, Jerry has served in several leadership roles at Hurricane Community Church and runs the Alumni Association for Clark High School. Jerry has made the most of retirement by connecting with others and serving the community.

One quote that Jerry has taken to heart throughout his life comes from "Markings" by Dag Hammarskjold, a former UN Secretary-General. In that book, the author writes: "If, while pleading another's cause, you are at the same time seeking something for yourself, you cannot hope to succeed." That is a good reminder to all of us to practice servant leadership throughout the year.


