Where in the world is ???

Tiffany Wilson ('18) is one busy graduate! When she isn't acting or directing in local theatre, or working as the Franklin branch manager of the Johnson County Library, she is traveling to Hungary and learning to speak Hungarian! Check it out.

I have had the amazing opportunity to travel to Budapest, Hungary five different times. I attend Hope's Point Baptist Church in Shelbyville, and our nonprofit organization, Mission 19:14 (based on Matthew 19:14) has lead a mission trip to Hungary every year since 2012. We work with kids and young adults, ages 10-21, who are foster kids or orphans, and many of them are of Roma descent. These kids are often "thrown away" by their culture and society, and do not have strong adult role models to look up to. Every single kid can share stories of how they have been abused—often by family members, friends, or foster parents. Many

times they will guit school because of the likelihood they will be prejudiced against when searching for a job later in life. They often resort to selling drugs or becoming involved in prostitution in order to make money.

After falling in the love with the country and its people, I've been learning to speak the language. Hungarians love it if you even attempt to speak the language, because no one speaks Hungarian except Hungarians. I've been using Transparent Language through the Johnson County Public Library to learn a foreign language and so can you!

DID YOU KNOW?



To Celebrate our 25th Year, we are going to have a little fun throughout the year by highlighting 25 things you didn't know about various groups in Johnson County. This month we are highlighting information about nonprofit organizations!

- 1. Over 200 people attended the All Aboard Community and Volunteer Fair to give back to our community through volunteering!
- 2. Johnson County 4-H is home to over 1,100 youth in the county and over 150 volunteers. One volunteer, Max Fitzpatrick, is being recognized at the state for being the oldest 4-H volunteer in the state of Indiana at 65 years of service with the program.
- 3. Midwest Food Bank serves 320 agencies in 72 counties throughout the state of Indiana.
- 4. In 2017, The Lord's Cupboard served 1,206 individuals who were coping with financial and other significant hardships. Since 1971, The Lord's Cupboard has been serving the Johnson County community as well as providing a shopping opportunity for the public.
- 5. The 24 Foundation mission is to inspire and engage communities to make an immediate impact on the lives of people affected by cancer, with a vision to have Cancer Navigation and Survivorship for all!
- 6. Did you know that 16,220 Johnson County individuals are food insecure?
- 7. Big Brothers Big Sisters is making a bold move to reach more kids in our community. The RISE Campaign is a \$7 million expansion campaign to purchase a permanent home for the agency at 1433 N Meridian Street.
- 8. Greater Greenwood Arts Council believes in an inspired community energized by the Arts!
- 9. Franklin Band Boosters, inspires a love of Instrumental music, experience in leadership and a family like no other!
- 10. No need to travel-you can learn about a different culture, traditions, foods all in the comfort of your home. Just host an international high school exchange student through PAX Program of Academic Exchange!
- 11. Did you know that 4050 Johnson County families spent over 50% of income for housing in 2014?
- 12. Leadership Johnson County is excited to begin the Youth Leadership Academy beginning in the 2019-2020 school year.
- 13. DDF's original name was Discover Historic Franklin, but was later changed to Discover Downtown Franklin. This year at Strawberries on the Square we sold 4,000 servings of Strawberry Shortcake!
- 14. Girls Inc. of Johnson County has been inspiring girls to be strong, smart, and bold for 78 years!
- 15. Did you know that 627 Johnson County school students were considered homeless in 2015-2016?
- 16. The Boys & Girls Club of Franklin has over 1200 members (kids ages 6-18) living in Johnson County that utilize one of our programs!
- 17. Resources of Hope is a foster care support organization dedicated to providing resources to meet the physical and emotional needs of foster children living in Johnson and surrounding counties. They are in Whiteland.
- 18. Last year, Partnership for a Healthier Johnson County presented the Young Lungs tobacco prevention program to 80 first grade classrooms in Johnson County, reaching 1,898 students. The program was developed in 1998 at Franklin College.
- 19. Bridges Alliance of Johnson County is a collaborative effort to end poverty by providing proven tools, resources, support, and relationships to foster stability and independence.
- 20. Did you know that currently 11,500 Johnson County individuals (7.6%) live below the federal poverty line?
- 21. By the end of 2018, Gateway's management team will have collectively 148 years of experience on the job.
- 22. The Leadership Johnson County Signature Program has graduated over 700 adults since 1995.
- 23. Over 40 nonprofits participated in the All Aboard Community and Volunteer Fair.
- 24. The Johnson County Community Foundation was pleased to underwrite All Aboard as it matches perfectly with their mission of "Connecting People Who Care With Causes That Matter!"
- 25. Upstream Prevention is an organization of community members passionate about reducing youth substance abuse and promoting positive mental health.



Franklin College Hosts Convocation Lecture Series

"The Founding of the Nation Through the Eyes of the Enslaved" Thursday, Oct. 25, 2018 | 7:00 p.m. Franklin College | Spurlock Center Gymnasium

Erica Armstrong Dunbar, Ph.D., is the Charles and Mary Beard Professor of History at Rutgers University. Her publications, teaching and documentary appearances have placed her among a small number of African-American women scholars who study black life, culture and gender up to the Civil War.

When George Washington was elected president, he reluctantly left behind his beloved Mount Vernon to serve in New York and then Philadelphia, the temporary seat of the nation's capital. In setting up his household, he brought along nine slaves, including Ona Judge.

Though Ona Judge lived a life of relative comfort, she was denied freedom. So, when the opportunity presented itself one spring day in Philadelphia, Judge left everything she knew to escape to New England. Yet freedom would not come without its costs. At age 22, Judge became the subject of an intense manhunt led by Washington, who used his political and personal contacts to try and recapture his property.

The convocation will focus on Dunbar's book, Never Caught: The Washingtons' Relentless Pursuit of Their Runaway Slave, Ona Judge.
