

She also made a connection with Volunteers of America and volunteered to make holiday cards with individuals transitioning out of corrections and into the community. The experience was so fulfilling that she plans to return to Volunteers of America on a monthly basis in 2013.

Tim is one Tangram client that recently met with success in his personal goal of finding employment. Tim is 55 years old and has been looking for a job for a long time. To increase his chances of success, staff conducted mock interviews with Tim, reviewed how to dress for success, and created a plan centered on his search for a job.

Thanks to Tim's perseverance and the efforts of those who worked with him, he finally met his goal of getting a job. He now works three days a week at a convenience store. Tim transformed himself into a contributing citizen and is the perfect example of how individuals and the larger community can benefit when the right types of supports are made available.
