



2022 MCCF HIGHLIGHTS

Several 2022 grants went to support physical repairs and improvements to buildings and structures. From top to bottom, and everything in between, more than \$150,000 went to seven organizations for these types of projects. Grants included repairing and restoring over 100 year old windows at the Masonic Temple, roof top improvements on the 4-H building, and new floors at the Boys & Girls Club. MCCF is helping organizations take care of their facilities so that quality programming and services may continue.

In partnership with the Crawfordsville Parks & Rec, we launched Camp Milligan. This all-day summer camp program was a huge success with 35 children participating. Campers enjoyed weekly field trips, hands-on learning, physical activities, and much more!

The Montgomery County Early Learning Center is moving forward. Strong partnerships with local government and businesses formed to fund the new center that will provide high quality care for 124 children, ages infant to five.
