## Halloween Parade

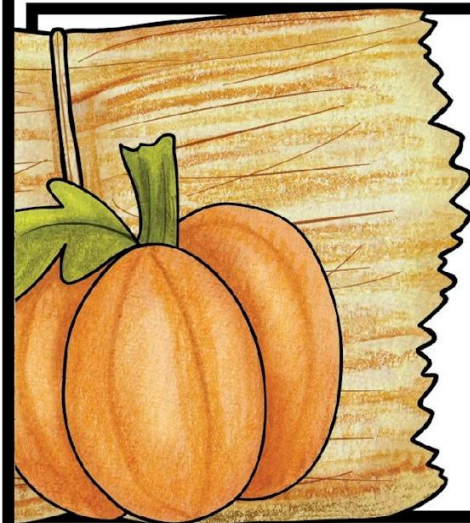

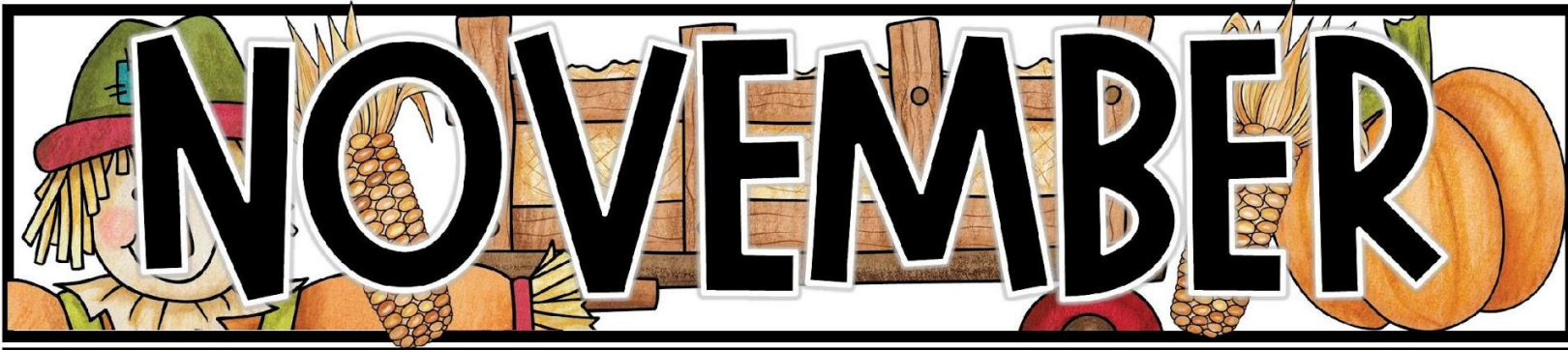
## Drop off and Pick Up
