1 **RESOLUTION #23-08** 2 **ENTITLED:** Nursing Home Care 3 **SUBMITTED BY:** Dick Huber, MD 4 5 WHEREAS, Hoosier physicians are concerned about the health services provided for our patients and 6 all Hoosiers in all medical care facilities, and 7 8 WHEREAS, AARP, a senior advocacy group for Americans, ranks Indiana's elder care system dead 9 last nationally, and 10 WHEREAS, Indiana nursing homes rank 48<sup>th</sup> nationally in staffing hours adjusted for how sick the 11 residents are which directly relates to the quality of care, and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, 22 Indiana county hospitals own 93% of the Indiana 534 nursing homes and in 2019 15 received \$679 million in supplemental Medicaid payments, more than any other state, and yet Indiana 16 nursing homes rank among the worst in the nation, and 17 WHEREAS. The National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine concluded: (#1) The 18 19 way in which the US finances, delivers, and regulates care in nursing home setting is ineffective, 20 inefficient, fragmented, and unsustainable; and (#2) Immediate action to initiate fundamental change is 21 necessary, and 22 23 WHEREAS, the National Academies recently published 'The National Imperative to Improve Nursing 24 Home Quality' with recommendations and general principles, therefore be it 25 26 RESOLVED, that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) take a leadership role to initiate and collaborate with other agencies, associations and organizations to consider and implement 27 28 appropriate recommendations and principles, such as published by the National Academies, to 29 improve the quality of care for our patients in Indiana's nursing homes, and be it further, 30 31 RESOLVED, that this resolution be adopted with referral to the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians (IAFP) Board of Directors for implementation and action. 32
