## **Classroom News:**

<u>Mrs. Snyder – 6<sup>th</sup> LA-6<sup>th</sup> grade ELA classes</u> are focusing on Theme this week. The students are reading a short story out of their big red book. This story will aid in the conversations about Theme. We will also begin to discuss Point of View. <u>Period 3:</u> is advancing toward the end of their novel. We continue to have Socratic Seminars about each chapter; focusing on one interpretive question found on canvas. Book Reports are due November 20<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Mr. Taylor – 6<sup>th</sup> Social Studies –</u>Students are completing our unit on the United States East of the Mississippi River and are beginning to learn about the Western USA.

<u>Mr. Taylor-7<sup>th</sup> LA-</u>Students have finished their 1st semester book report and are now beginning to read the Outsiders for our first semester Novel. They're working through the characterization of Pony boy, Soda pop, and others this week!

<u>Mr. Gulley – PE/Health-</u> We will be in the Gym Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, we will pass out locks and lockers for the students, plus we will be doing Physical Fitness exercising. Thursday and Friday I have the Jacy House speaking to the students on Speak Up Be Safe.

<u>Mrs. Fields – 6<sup>th</sup> Math –</u> Be on the lookout for your child's midterm next week. Students will be bringing them home on Friday, November 16<sup>th</sup>. **Period 2** tackled volume and surface area as a warm-up this

week. We also starting solving equations by identifying and isolating the variable, using the inverse operation, substituting, and checking! We started with whole numbers, but will move on to solving equations with decimals and fractions next week! **Period 3, 4, 6** worked with fraction and decimal word problems as a warm-up this week. They had to determine which operation to use and solve it. We also began converting between fractions, decimals and percent's! We will take a quiz next week.

<u>Mr. Hofmann– 6<sup>th</sup> Science -</u> 6th Grade Science has continued to work with sound and light waves. We have discussed and modeled transverse and longitudinal waves in a variety of ways. Ask your child what- crest, amplitude, and wavelength are.

<u>Miss Severance – 7<sup>th</sup> Language Arts –</u>Miss Severance – Language Arts 7 – This week students in all classes presented their book reports. In addition, they all started a class novel. Period 2 has begun reading <u>Red</u> <u>Scarf Girl</u> and Periods 3, 4, and 7 have begun reading <u>The Outsiders</u>. Students took their vocabulary test on Thursday, as well. We will be focused on the class novels for the next few weeks.

<u>Mr. Bruns – 7<sup>th</sup> Social Studies –</u>This week the students finished up working on their presentations over the 11 major Chinese dynasties. We will continue with Ancient China next week as students use the information collected during their classmates' presentations to think deeper about the various dynasties. We will also explore a little more about the Silk Road and its importance to the history of the world.
