Math Tips for Parents: Beyond 2 + 2 = 4...

Parents should encourage creative problem solving. Problem solving is the basis of good mathematical thinking, and the problems do not have to involve only numbers. Below are the sort of mathematical reasoning problems that the Indiana Academic Standards ask:

- Explain how you know that
 7/12th is greater than 1/3rd but less than 2/3^{rds}.
- Draw a picture to solve this problem: You need to put 20 ice cubes into 5 glasses. How many cubes should go into each glass?
- What's another way to arrange the furniture in a particular room?
- Bailey has 39 moon stickers and 52 star stickers. How many more star stickers than moon stickers does she have?
- Elliott says that 1/8 is greater than ¼ because 8 is greater than 4. Is she right? Explain your answer.
- How many different ways can Julie measure flour to get half a cup?
- Martin buys a sandwich for \$4.00, an apple for \$.95, and

a soda for \$2.20. How much did he pay in all? How much change did Martin receive if he paid with a \$20 bill?

 Adam has \$20 to spend. He wants to spend \$3 each day for 5 days and \$4 on the weekend. Does he have enough money? If so, how much will he have left?

Choose gifts that develop problem-solving skills. Blocks,

building sets, geometric tile sets, puzzles, board games, weather stations, maps, puzzle books, strategy games, chemistry sets, and origami are just a few of the gifts that will give your child pleasure and knowledge at the same time.
