RESOLUTION #23-11 ENTITLED: Increasing Family Medicine Involvement In Indiana Maternal Mortality Conversation and Fostering FMOB Connection **SUBMITTED BY:** Alison Case, MD WHEREAS Indiana has the 3rd highest maternal mortality rate in the United States at 44 deaths per 100.000 live births and. WHEREAS the maternal mortality rate among Black women in Indiana is 93% higher than their counterparts and, WHEREAS half of women (50%) who died in 2020 in Indiana accessed prenatal care during the first trimester and another 15.2% received no prenatal care at all, and, WHEREAS mental health conditions (other than substance use disorders) definitely or probably contributed to 34% of pregnancy-associated deaths in Indiana, and, WHEREAS Family Medicine physicians who provide obstetric services are ideally placed to easily transition pregnant people from primary care into prenatal care, helping to ensure adequate prenatal

and postpartum care and,
WHEREAS Family Medicine physicians are ideally suited to provide both obstetric care and mental

health care, and,

WHEREAS it is unclear to what extent Family Medicine physicians are involved in state-wide conversations around maternal mortality and,

WHEREAS Family Medicine physicians who provide obstetric care face specific barriers to providing that care including restrictive hospital privileging, hostile treatment by other specialties, difficulty maintaining privileges, and difficulty finding positions offering obstetrics, therefore be it

RESOLVED that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians investigate the involvement of Family Medicine physicians in maternal mortality conversations across the state and advocate for representation on the Indiana Maternal Mortality Review Committee, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Indiana Academy of Family Physicians will create a database of Family Medicine physicians in Indiana providing obstetrics services for the purpose of networking and data collection.
