Be sure to have your Kroger Plus card handy and register your card with your organization after you sign up. Člick on Sign In/Register - Most participants are new online customers, so they must click on CREATE AN ACCOUNT. Sign up for a Kroger Rewards Account by entering zip code, clicking on favorite store, entering your email address and creating a password, and agreeing to the terms and conditions.

Next, check your email inbox and click on the link within the body of the email. Click on My Account and use your email address and password to proceed to the next step. Click on Edit Kroger Community Rewards information and input your Kroger Plus card number. Update or confirm your information.

Enter NPO number (DM612) or name of organization, select organization from list and click on confirm. To verify you are enrolled correctly, you will see your organization's name on the right side of your information page.
