



Mathematics Faculty Present at National Conference

For the second consecutive year, the entire Franklin College mathematics faculty was invited to present a four-hour minicourse at Mathfest, an annual conference sponsored by the Mathematical Association of America (MAA). This year's event was held in Chicago, Ill., July 26 – 29, 2017.

The hands-on workshop, titled
"Creating a Purposeful Student
Learning Experience," provided
attendees with the knowledge to
create a learning-focused
departmental culture in and out of the
classroom designed to help students

develop skills to achieve not only in their classes, but also in the workplace and in graduate school. It also provided the framework to help faculty at fellow colleges and universities learn to work together effectively to develop and implement plans to achieve desired outcomes and assess progress within their departments.

The minicourse presenters included Whiteland resident Dan Callon, Ph.D., professor of mathematics, as well as Franklin residents John Boardman,

Ph.D., professor of mathematics, Paul Fonstad, Ph.D., assistant professor of mathematics, Justin Gash, Ph.D., associate professor of mathematics and head of the Division of Business, Computing and Mathematics, Stacy Hoehn, Ph.D., assistant professor of mathematics and Angie Walls, director of the math center and lecturer.

In addition, Boardman, Fonstad and Hoehn each had papers accepted for presentation at the conference, as did student Cody Burker, a junior majoring in applied mathematics and computer science.
