

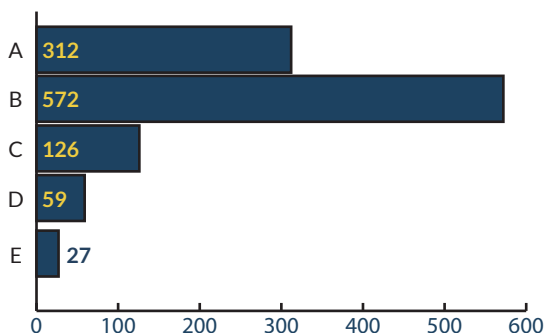

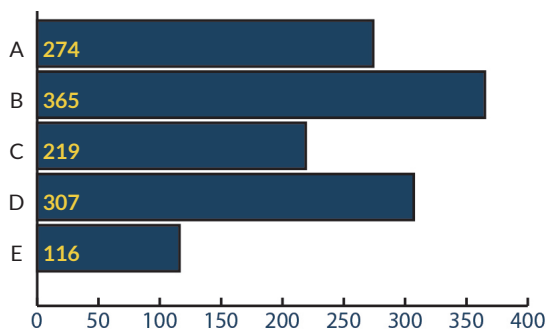

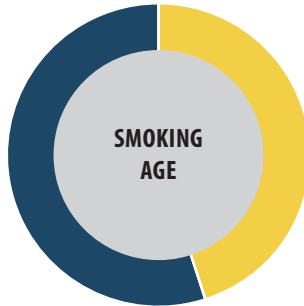

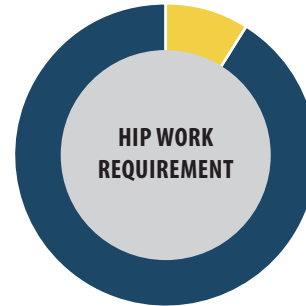

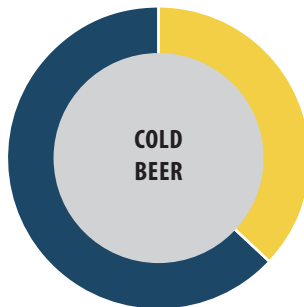
- 6.** Should Indiana require able-bodied adults to work or look for work in order to receive publicly funded health care coverage under the Healthy Indiana Plan?

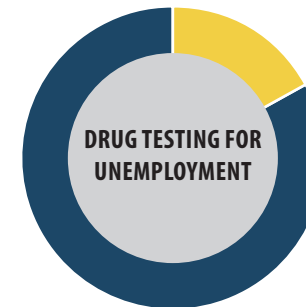
- 7.** Do you support or oppose allowing licensed retail stores, including gas stations, to sell cold beer for carryout? (This is currently limited to liquor stores.)
