7 In the past year our Academy's CME offerings have consisted of a mixture of live meetings and virtual  
8 events.  
9

10 We hosted our annual Fall Conference in a hybrid live and virtual format (using Zoom) from November  
11 19-21, 2021. Carmel's Medical Academic Center served as the venue for this meeting and we were  
12 able to utilize their affordable built-in webcasting technology. We offered IAFP/AAFP members a  
13 variety of CME topics including a unique three-hour sleep health program, a leadership topic, a  
14 legislative update, and a wide variety of clinical CME. We also offered a non-CME knee injection  
15 workshop for live attendees. Sunday's program consisted of an evening Virtual KSA Study Group  
16 conducted via Zoom. This was the second time we have offered a Virtual KSA and it went very  
17 smoothly. Attendees could earn up to 12.25 AAFP Live Prescribed CME Credits over the course of the  
18 conference. We had about 50 registrants for this event and evaluations were positive.

20 On February 16, 2022, we held our annual Winter Wednesday event at the Marriott in downtown  
21 Indianapolis. The event consisted of a KSA Study Group in the morning, a hands-on POCUS workshop  
22 in the afternoon, and our annual Legislative Reception in the evening. About 50 family physicians  
23 attended the meeting which offered AAFP CME credit as well as ABFM credit for the KSA.

25 On Thursday, May 19, 2022, the IAFP's Research Day was held in Carmel and offered AAFP CME  
26 credit. Our lunch time program consisted of a leadership development seminar aimed at residents.  
27 Presenters included Commission members Teresa Lovins, MD, and Rishet Patel, MD.

29 This fall, we are planning a series of Virtual ABFM KSA Study Groups to help members with their  
30 board review journey. Registrants will earn 10 ABFM Certification Points and 8 AAFP Prescribed CME  
31 credits following successful completion. The Virtual KSAs will lead attendees through the 60-question  
32 Knowledge Self-Assessment (KSA) with other family physicians in a fast paced, group discussion  
33 format. We will report the group's answers to the ABFM. We plan to continue with the small group  
34 virtual format that has worked very well for us in the past, offering time saving benefits versus larger  
35 virtual KSA groups that we have offered previously in partnership with other state chapters.

37 The Commission on Education has been active on its email listserv to review potential topics and  
38 speakers for upcoming events. The 2022 Fall Conference is in the planning stages and will be held at  
39 the Medical Academic Center in Carmel.

41 As always, the Commission bases its decisions on IAFP member CME Needs Assessments and  
42 member comments from previous CME events. Our goal is to meet our members' educational needs in  
43 as efficient a manner as possible.
