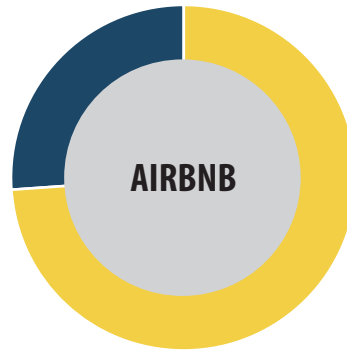
- 1.** Do you support or oppose the sale of alcohol in licensed retail stores on Sundays, which is currently prohibited in Indiana?

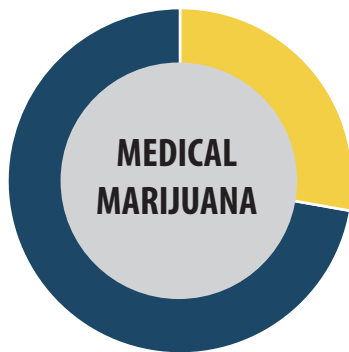
- 2.** Should local governments be able to restrict homeowners from renting out their property with short-term rental services like Airbnb?

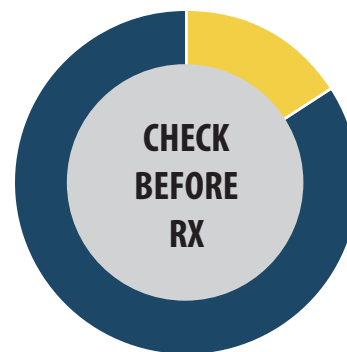
- 3.** Should Indiana legalize marijuana for medical use?

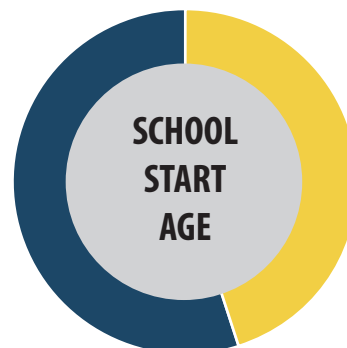
- 5.** Hoosiers currently must register about a month before Election Day in order to vote. Should the law be changed so you can both register and vote on Election Day?

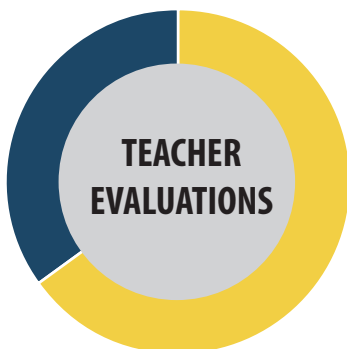
