As used in this clause, "litigation" includes any judicial action or administrative law proceeding under federal or state law. C. The implementation of security systems. D. A real property transaction including: \_\_\_\_ (i) a purchase; \_\_\_\_ (ii) a lease as lessor; \_\_\_\_ (iii) a lease as lessee; \_\_ (iv) a transfer; \_\_\_ (v) an exchange; or \_ (vi) a sale; by the governing body up to the time a contract or option is executed by the parties. This clause does not affect a political subdivision's duty to comply with any other statute that governs the conduct of the real property transaction, including IC 36-1-10 or IC 36-1-11. E. School consolidation. \*However, all such strategy discussions must be necessary for competitive or bargaining reasons and may not include competitive or bargaining adversaries. For discussion of the assessment, design, and implementation of school safety and security measures, plans, and systems. Interviews and negotiations with industrial or commercial prospects or agents of industrial or commercial prospects by the Indiana economic development corporation, the office of tourism development, the Indiana finance authority, the ports of Indiana, an economic development commission, the Indiana state department of agriculture, a local economic development organization, or a governing body of a political subdivision. \*However, this subdivision does not apply to any discussions regarding research that is prohibited under IC 16-34.5-1-2 or under any other law. 5. To receive information about and interview prospective employees. 6. With respect to any individual over whom the governing body has jurisdiction: A. To receive information concerning the individual's alleged misconduct; and

B. To discuss, before a determination, that individual's status as an employee,
